## Farm Women Will Mark Anniversary

The Society of Farm Women 1 will celebrate its 50th anniversary with a dinner meeting at the Lititz Church of the Brethren today, Sept. 30 at 12:30 p.m. to which all former members have been invited.

The Society of Farm Women 1 was the first society to organize in Lancaster County. On January 27, 1917, the first group of women met.

Their purpose was social improvement, enlightenment of important topics of the day and taking up matters of mutual benefit to the community.

The Society was first named "Die Hausfrauen" by Mrs. Frank Black, Somerset County, who was the originator. The name was adopted because Pennsylvania is Dutch and its success in agriculture is attributed to these thrifty people. The name was also a tribute to our forefathers. In November 1917, because of World War I, the name was changed to its present title.

The Rev. Harry T. Richwine, Lebanon, will be the guest speaker. The program will include devotions by Mrs. Scott Garman, a reading by Linda Ulrich, a historical reminiscence of the Society by Mrs. Martin Moore, and a vocal solo by Mrs. Howard Eib, a former member, accompanied by Mrs. Roy Brubaker. Mrs. Neil Clark will serve as the Mistress of Ceremonies.

The planning and program committee for the affair consisted of Mrs. Daniel Brubaker, Mrs. Clark, Mrs. Moore, Mrs. Willis Bucher and Mrs. Roy Brubaker. Mrs. Graybill Hollinger is in charge of the decorations.



Twenty years ago the U. S. The Act also provides for a breakfast program for the first time.


