Lloyd Wolf Cow Has 1,019 Lbs.

A Registered Holstein cow owned by Lloyd Wolf, Quarryville R2, completed the highest 305 day lactation according to the August monthly news letter of the Red Rose Dairy Herd Improvement Association of Lancaster County. Carnot produced 21,779 lbs. of milk, 1,019 lbs. of butterfat with a 4.7% test. Second high lactation was completed by a Registered Holstein cow owned by Donald S. Eby, Gordonville R1 Dianne produced 20,585 lbs of milk, 971 lbs. of butterfat with a 4.7% test in 305 days.

The herd of Robert F & Joan B. Book, 11 South Hershey Ave., Bareville, had the highest monthly butterfat average. This herd of 318 Registered & Grade Holstein cows averaged 1,594 lbs. of milk, 64 lbs. of butterfat with a 4.0% test. The herd of J.

Mrs. David Holt, Lincoln University, who is serving the Middle Atlantic Region on the American Farm Bureau Federations' Womens Committee, explained the woman's role in the association and spoke on the purpose and function of the Lancaster County Teachers Council.

Mrs. Clyde Wivell, chairman of the Women's Committee, said that the phrase "Agriculture Is Where the Action Is", could be used synonymously with the phrase "Education Is Where the Action Is" in the three proposed Vo Tech Schools.

J. Richard Murr, Coordinator of these Vo Tech Schools, told the group of its program and growth as well as the value of what Abe Lincoln said, "Wanting to work is so rare a merit that it should be encouraged."

Supervising Principal of the E. Lancaster County Schools, Robert P. Simon, explained the Vo-Ag program from elementary grades through high school and told the group of the areas of instruction such as conservation, safety around the farm, safety in hunting and around machinery, agribusiness and general vo-agriculture.

Harold Rohrer, State Director, talked about the policy development of the association and Vernon Blackstone told of its philosophy and concluded

with a citizenry quiz.
