The results of the FFA judging contests at Lampeter Fair were announced Thursday afternoon at the regular meeting of the county Vo-Ag teachers at the Lampeter Strasburg High School in Lampeter. Ephrata High School retained the plaque for the most school points with a grand total of 594.6. Richard Rohrer, Lancaster R2, from Penn Manor, won the 25 dollar savings bond with the top score in the dairy judging. Richard had 279.2 points.

In the livestock judging, Aldus Martin Drumore, from the Solanco High School was top with 473.2 points.

Larry Burkhardt, East Earl R1, had the top overall score of 712.9 points. Larry is from the New Holland School.

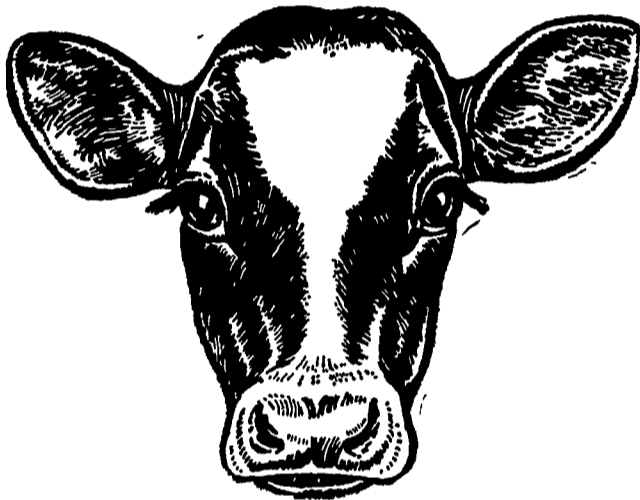
