

Five Acre Corn Contest Rules Stated

The rules for the five acre corn contest were announced this week by Arnold G. Lueck, Associate Agricultural Agent. They are as follows:

1. Only machine harvested, either picker or picker-sheller or combine, will be done. No hand harvesting.
2. In order to obtain a higher degree of sampling accuracy, five (5) randomly selected locations within each field will be chosen. At each of the chosen locations we will harvest two rows. The distance to harvest will depend on your row width. We will likely cut away by hand a three foot area at

each end of the plot to be harvested. Two row harvesters will have one (1) sample weight per location, and a total of five (5) per field. One row harvesters will have two (2) sample weights per location, and a total of ten (10) per field.

3. Moisture sample will be taken from the harvested plots.
4. A population check is not required before harvest time. Field information, cultural practices and so on will be needed as usual. Have soil test handy.
5. It will be all right to open up the field. This is recommended.
6. Call the Extension office several days in advance of when you plan to pick the field

Holstein Type Classification Program Starts

The type classification program for Registered Holstein Breeders in Southeastern Pennsylvania, including Lancaster County, will begin December 4, according to David C. Slusser, Fieldman for the Pennsylvania Holstein Association.

Participation is open to anyone with a Registered Holstein female that has freshened. Also males over two years old are eligible to be scored. You must complete the application and mail it with the group program fees to the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, Biat-

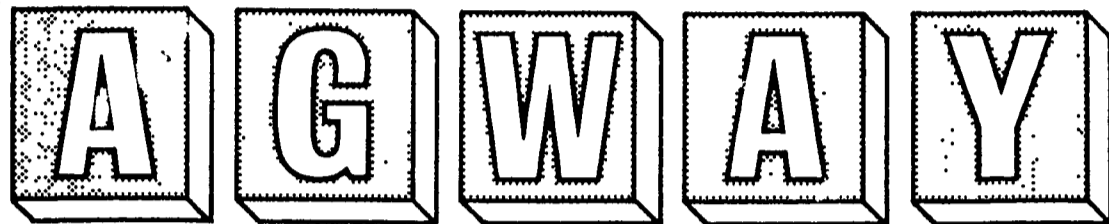
State Soil And Water Meet To Be In Lancaster

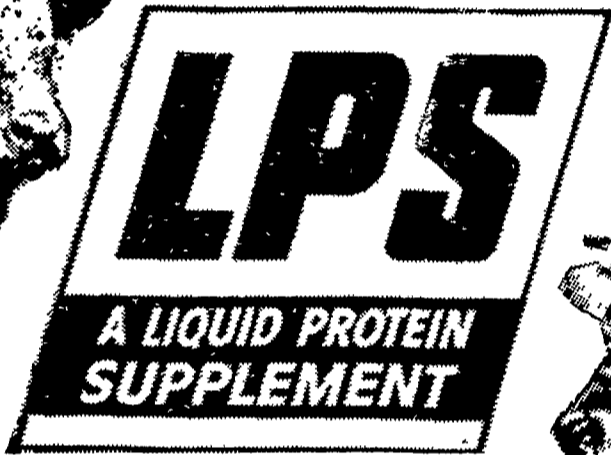
Approximately 400 district directors, conservation agency representatives and conservation leaders from Pennsylvania and surrounding states are ex-

The conference will open with committee meetings and auto tours for early arrivals Wednesday afternoon, November 8, followed by an evening program sponsored by the host district of Lancaster County. Thursday's agenda includes a breakfast meeting sponsored by the New Holland Division of Speer Rand Corporation, with Miss Rebekah Sheaffer, a former Lancaster County school teacher as guest speaker, a panel discussion and presentation of awards a tour in the afternoon and the annual banquet in the evening at which Lieut. Governor Raymond J. Broderick will be the speaker. The conference closes with a district directors workshop and the annual business meeting of the state association on Friday morning.

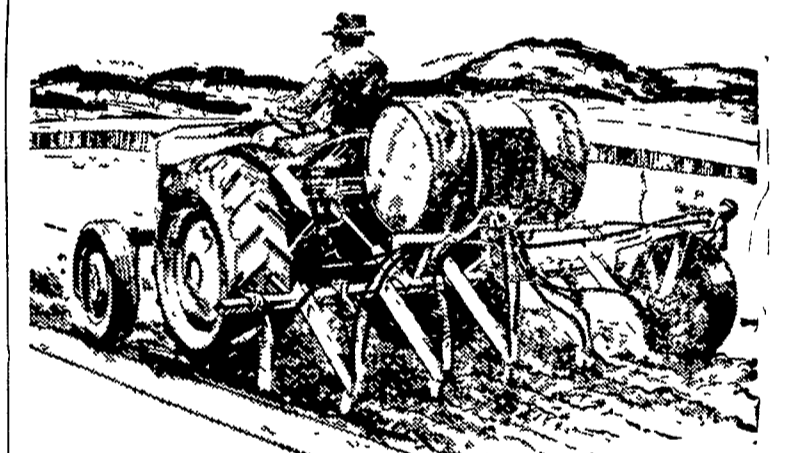
