Convenience Foods — Are They Economical?

The 25 million women who work outside the home daily have money to spend on food, they demand high-quality foods, and have little time for the preparation of family meals. Convenience foods appear regularly on the tables of these homemakers.

Homemakers vote for new, frozen corn-on-the-cob, stuffed foods by buying them — frozen baked potatoes, cheese in a spray can, and fancy frozen dinners, usually cost more than fresh ingredients.

Usually prepared food items cost more than fresh forms. Exceptions include frozen concentrated orange juice, frozen green peas, canned orange juice, and fruit cocktail, and some cake mixes.

Employment by newspapers averaged 353,800 during 1966, a 2 percent increase over 1965 and an increase of 42 percent since 1947.

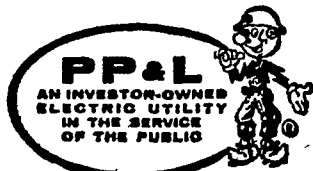
