State Grange Attendance May Reach 1,800

Harrisburg — Founding of the Grange 100 years ago will be observed in a tribute to William Saunders, its first national master, Monday noon, Oct. 23, in Gettysburg at the opening of the 95th annual session (October 23-26) of the Pennsylvania State Grange, John W. Scott, master, said today.

A life-size figure of Saunders will be unveiled in the National Civil War Wax Museum not far from the Gettysburg National Cemetery for which he drew the original plans under commission of President Lincoln. At the dedication of the cemetery by the President 104 years ago, on the occasion of his immortal Gettysburg Address, Saunders shared the platform with him, sitting two seats away in the front row.

Saunders, native of Scotland and world-renowned authority on landscape architecture, was superintendent of the propagating gardens of the then new U.S. Department of Agriculture. His plans for the Gettysburg burial grounds became a pattern for other national cemeteries that were established later.

Scott will speak at the unveiling and dedication of the Saunders statue done in wax. The Rev. James Gold, Middleburg, state Grange chaplain, will give the invocation. G. Wallis Caulk, Sr., Woodside, Del., state master for that state, will join in the ceremony as representative of the National Grange to the convention.

Talent contests, reports, action on resolutions, election of officers, initiations and a tour of the Battlefield will mark the 4-day session. Top performers in four different categories of talent will be named to represent the State Grange at the 101st convention of the National Grange, Nov. 12-21 at Syracuse, N.Y.

More than 500 men and women will be initiated into the sixth (state) degree of the Grange Wednesday night, Oct. 25, in the auditorium of Gettysburg High School where all general sessions will be held. This will qualify them to receive the seventh (national) degree at Syracuse along with several hundred Pennsylvania candidates.

Scott said attendance at Gettysburg may reach 1,800 for one of the largest state meetings in recent years. Delegates will represent a membership of 62,000 in 643 subordinate Granges in 65 counties.

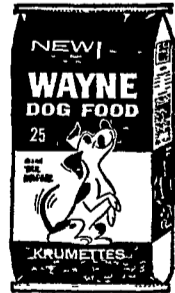

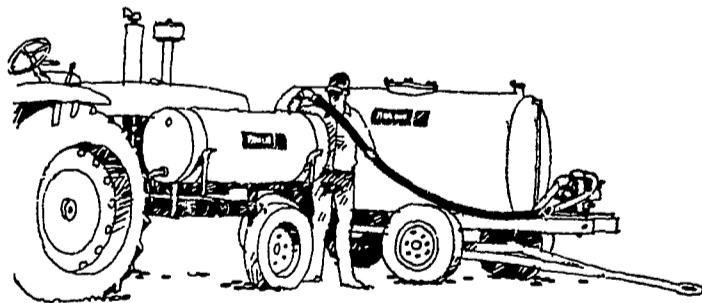
