Keep Water Hoses Out Of Pesticide Water

When filling a spray tank or when rinsing and washing pesticide equipment or containers, never permit the hose or faucet to extend into the pesticide or the rinse water.

"Contaminated water should never reach the mouth of the water supply outlet," warns David Shriver, pesticide-chemicals leader at the University of Maryland.

Shriver advises leaving a large air-gap between the water source and the contaminated water since surface contamination of the hose could be dangerous to someone drinking from the hose or faucet.
