Eastern Pennsylvania And New Jersey Weekly Review

Prices unchanged to 1/2c lower on light type hens, unchanged on heavy type. Demand fair but unaggressive on light type with offerings generally in excess of number that processors can handle. Waiting periods running up to 2 weeks to move hens from farms common. Interest for heavy type fair to good. Offerings adequate to occasionally barely adequate.

Demand generally light and unaggressive. Occasional interest noted to cover forthcoming ice-packed Thanksgiving needs; however, trading too limited to quote prices. Processing continues active on contractual or previously committed birds.

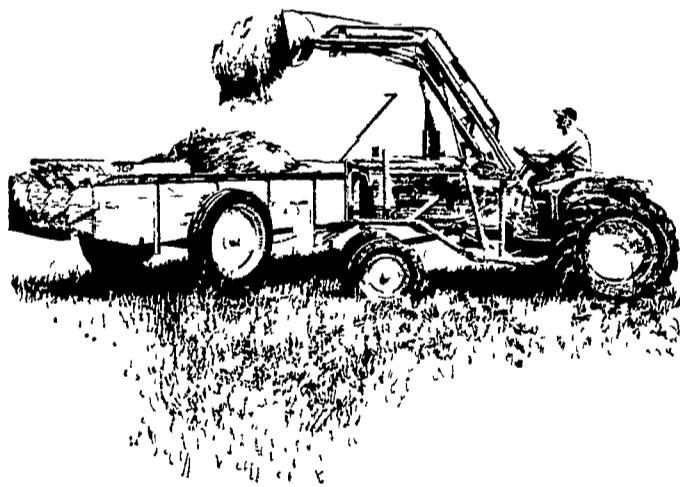
