The herd of Red Rose Research Center, 226 Pitney Rd, had the highest monthly butterfat average This herd of 199 Registered Holstein cows averaged 1,484 lbs. of milk, 58 lbs. of butterfat with a 3.9% test The herd of Levi S Stoltzfus, Ronks R1, placed second This herd of 166 Registered & Grade Holstein cows averaged 1,482 lbs of milk. 56 lbs of butterfat with a 3.8% test

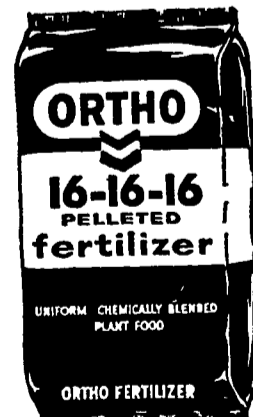
