Contributions of \$5 each were given to the County Campaign and Needlework Guild. An auction of items was held with Mrs. Albert Graybill serving as auctioneer.

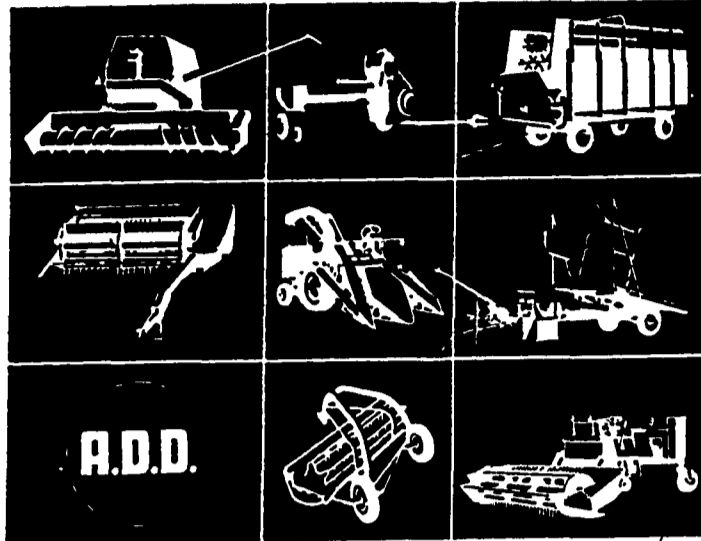

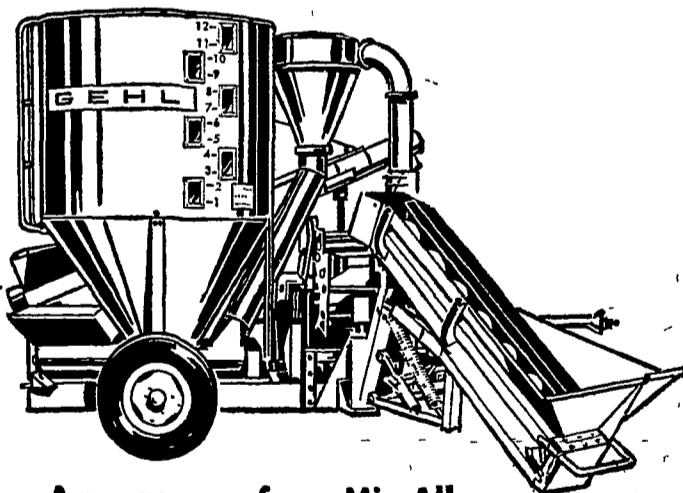
