Proper Storing Of Machinery Very Important

Storing farm equipment properly during the idle winter season can give you a head start on field work next spring, according to Tom Williams, extension agricultural engineer at the University of Delaware. Don't take a chance on bearings that fail, belts that slip, clutches that don't slip, balers that won't tie a knot, plows that won't scour or fertilizer mechanisms that won't turn. Proper storage means protecting metal parts of a machine from rust and corrosion

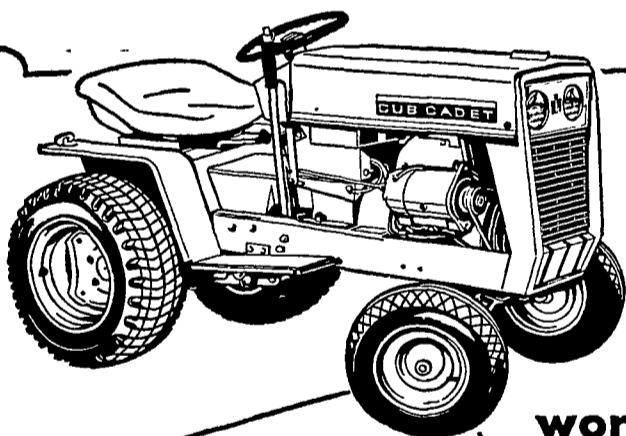

Take off machine belts and from rust and corrosion when store in a dark, cool place, it's not being used than it does. Williams advises If you can't remove the belts, at least loosen them during off-season storage. Block up machines so the machine thoroughly and storing it in a protected location—inside, if possible. Lubricate all bearing which normally need lubrication; remove roller chains, clean and store. Some people think they're in oil. Unprotected metal parts dynamic, just because they explode easily.
