degrees) 50 to 55 minutes. Cool. For glaze, combine sugar, syrup and salt. Beat until well blended. Spread on cooled cake.

Here's a large quantity recipe for a holiday cranberry drink.

CRANBERRY NOG

6½ quarts cranberry juice cocktail
1½ quarts water OR apricot nectar OR prune juice
25 eggs, beaten
Combine juices. Add beaten eggs. Chill and serve. Foam on top will fill ¼ to ½ inch in glass. Makes 100 (½ cup or 4 ounce) portions.

CRANBERRY CREAM DESSERT SALAD

3 cups miniature marshmallows
1 #2 can crushed pineapple, well drained
1 3-oz. pkg cream cheese
½ pint whipping cream

1 pound fresh or frozen cranberries, chopped
Combine ½ package (1½ cups) miniature marshmallows with well-drained crushed pineapple. Break cream cheese into small pieces and mix with whipping cream and remaining ½ package (1½ cups) marshmallows. Place both pineapple-marshmallow mixture and marshmallow-cream mixture in the refrigerator for several hours or overnight until marshmallows are well softened. Shortly before serving, beat marshmallow mixture until like whipped cream. Fold in the pineapple-marshmallow mixture and 4 cups chopped fresh cranberries. Place in serving dish or dishes and refrigerate until served.

NOTE: the ingredients for this salad can all be prepared the night before use.

CRANBERRY PUNCH

1 cup uncooked rolled oats
½ cup all-purpose flour
1 cup brown sugar
¼ cup butter
1 1-lb. can whole cranberry sauce
1 quart vanilla ice cream
Heat oven to 350 degrees. Mix oats, flour, and brown sugar. Cut in butter until crumbly. Place half of this mixture in an 8x8" greased cake dish. Cover with cranberry sauce. Top with rest of mixture. Bake 45 minutes at 350 degrees. Serve hot in squares topped with scoops of vanilla ice cream. Serves 6 to 8.

Ladies, Have You Heard? . . .

Teach Young Child Street Safety

Crossing the street holds many dangers for the young child. But you can help him to develop certain built-in-precautions.

Hold your child's hand as you're ready to cross the street. As he holds your hand, he must learn to look both ways before stepping off the curb. Set a good example yourself and the child will remember that the curb is a refuge from danger. Stand on the curb until you can walk across the street.

Help your child establish the habit of always walking — not running — in the street. A child should step off the curb and walk briskly across the street. A motorist may become confused when he sees a child running across the street in front of him. Medium apples make about a pound.

Buying Apples

Red color of apples doesn't necessarily indicate sweet apple flavor and desirable texture. The background color of an apple is more important. Pale yellow or ivory background develops fullest flavor. Light green background colored apples continue to sweeten some after harvest.

Avoid green apples, because they never develop peak, sweet flavor.

Buy apples for the specific thing you want to make. Small apples make a good choice for school lunches or snacking.

Medium size apples are best for general use. Three or four

Large sizes of apples are good for fresh eating and baking whole.

Reinforce Child's Garments

The garments you buy for your child may last longer if you reinforce points of wear with a few stitches.

Add a second stitching at the waist and underarm seams.

Inspect all seams closely to catch any broken stitches.

Restitch seams where they need greater strength.

Check buttonholes to see if they need extra stitches at corners for reinforcement.

Reinforce children's clothes when you buy them to save yourself mending time later on.
