LIVE HENS

Prices of light type hens held about unchanged from the past few weeks. Heavy type hens worked higher from prices last reported several weeks ago. Demand on light type ranged dull to occasionally fair as some plants only operating part time. Offerings while considerably less than early in month generally fully adequate for needs. Trade advices indicate a keen interest being shown regarding the Government ready to cook hen purchase program, however, no active bidding reported from the area. 


