Fulton Grange #66 held its regular meeting November 13 at the Grange Hall in Oakryn with Richard Holloway presiding. The Charter was draped in memory of Mrs. Ada Dinsmore.

The Youth Committee is still receiving paper for the scrap drive for benefit of Boy Scout Troop 330. About sixty people attended their Halloween masquerade and they will sponsor the Christmas caroling, the date to be announced later.

Twenty people from Fulton Grange attended the State Grange convention at Gettysburg October 24-26 and twelve took the sixth degree. Mr. and Mrs. Clifford W. Holloway Jr. are attending the National Grange convention at Syracuse, N.Y., Nov. 12-15.

The Grange went on record opposing SB1076, an alternate bill to create a county health department. This bill was introduced by Lancaster County's two Senators and Lancaster County voters just voted their opposition to a county health unit.

A donation was given to the Tuberculosis and Health Society of Lancaster County.

Mrs. Jesse Wood was in charge of the program: Lawrence Temple, Scout Master of Boy Scout Troop 330, and scouts Donald Adams, Richard Black, Mike Shuler and Mark Sawyer showed how each scout meeting opens giving the flag salute, scout sign, oath and repeating the scout laws. They demonstrated mouth to mouth resuscitation, putting a splint on a broken arm, control of bleeding and bandages. Mr. and Mrs. Gyles Brown, delegates to the ninety-fifth session of the Pa. State Grange, gave reports. Clair Murphy led in group singing of some new Grange centennial songs.

Miss Anita Gaivin, Fulton Grange's contestant in the Miss Solanco contest will exhibit her talent at the next meeting Nov. 27. Gyles Brown is in charge of supplying tickets to the Grangers for the Miss Solanco contest November 25.

The next meeting will also be corn and pie night. The Home Economics committee is in charge of the pie contest. All ladies are asked to enter either in the apple, plain or

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tion of President Johnson, June 30, 1967, limiting annual importation of dairy products to one billion pounds of milk equivalent annually.

The Grange also supported the Feed Grain Program for 1968 and supported 50% payment of domestic wheat market certificates to producers at wheat sign-up time, but opposed planning for harvest of soy-

beans or other seed crops on diverted acres.

The Grange opposes any release below parity level any strategic reserves accumulated as needed or inadvertently accumulated in the national or international interest. The Grange however, favors expansion of trade in non-strategic goods and agriculture products and reaffirmed its strong support for tariff reductions included in the Kennedy Round. The Grange also favors the adoption of new legislation to replace the expiring 1962 Trade Expansion Act. The Grange opposes aid to countries "making appreciable assistance or sales of strategic materials to our enemies."

The Grange favors raising wheat price support to domestic price support levels for all wheat exported for foreign aid. The Grange favors adequate appropriations for more farm products research and more rigid control of weeds and pests.

Recommending the establishment of a National Grange committee on collective bargaining,

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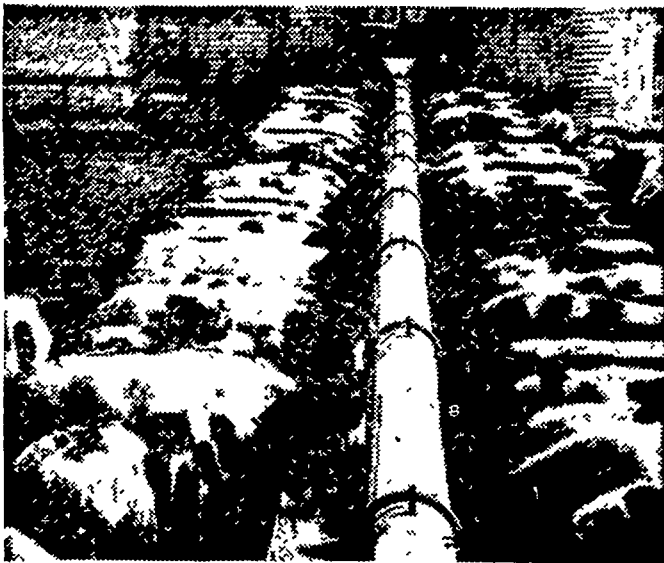
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
