the Grange endorsed continued and increased use of the present farm cooperative structure to carry our collective merchandising

The Grange favors a new long term, low interest rate financing program of farm capital credit to assist young farmers.

The Grange also favors a general policy to help developing nations improve agriculture capacity by providing American know-how with grants in aid. The Grange opposes foreign aid to communist countries unless it serves our national interest, but favors granting of normal credit terms to other countries on the basis of good credit rating and not denied solely because of political ideology.

Regarding Vietnam, the Grange commended the administration for seeking an honorable and just end to the conflict in Vietnam, but favors careful assessment and approval by the President and Congress before embarking on any new foreign military commitments.

The Grange recommends cutting the national budget by eliminating or modifying programs not absolutely essential to the economy and immediate welfare of the nation. It favors a surtax levy if budget restrictions are insufficient to relieve inflationary pressures.

In other action, the Grange urged prudent use of monies for relief or poverty programs and dropping all able-bodied persons from relief roles if they refuse employment.

The Grange favors review of the Head Start Program, but calls for improved rural education including proper sex education programs. The Grange favors more local control of

schools, better methods of detecting mental health problems and renewed its support of constitutional amendment to allow voluntary school prayer and Bible reading.

The Grange opposes teacher strikes, favors instead, arbitration to settle problems and commends teachers for untiring efforts in the advance of education in recent years.

The Grange favors legislation with maximum penalty and rigid enforcement for illegal possession and sale of harmful drugs. Efforts to lower medical expenses and eliminate hospital admittance fees charged by doctors were endorsed as were efforts probing the high cost of drugs.

The Grange opposed an income tax on social security benefits and also opposes any legislation providing a guaranteed annual income, favors retention of states' right to work laws and constitutional amendment permitting states to reapportion one house of their legislatures on a basis other than population, opposes general registration of firearms and further encroachment by federal agencies, executive departments or Congress on the rights of states and citizens.

Millersville Farmer Has Top Corn Yield

John H Charles of Millersville was given special recognition on November 14, for producing a corn yield of 183.1 bushels per acre. This is more than double the Pennsylvania state average corn yield for the past seven years. Altogether, Charles harvested 915.5 bushels of number 2 corn from a measured 5 acres for his 183.1 bushel average.

In producing his exceptional yield he used the single cross hybrid, Funk's G-4644, planted in 38 inch rows, with 19,500 plants per acre at harvest. He fertilized with 132.8 pounds of actual nitrogen, 160.4 pounds of actual phosphate, 132.8 pounds of actual potash and 10 tons of manure per acre.

Jason Millingar, Funk's G-Hybrid corn dealer in this area, presented Charles with a Documented Yield Award following certification of his yield. Jim Funk, Funk's G-Hybrid District Sales Manager from Quarryville, participated in the presentation.

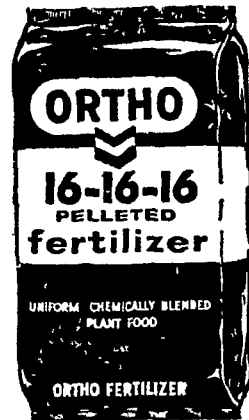
