Supply included an estimated 50% slaughter steers, 15% cows and bulls with the balance mainly feeder steers.

CATTLE—Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers were steady. Slaughter heifers sold steady to 25 lower, mostly steady. Cows were steady to 50 lower, while bulls were unchanged. In the carlot dressed meat trade at Chicago, Choice steer beef 50 to 1.00 higher, Good steady. Heifer beef 50-1.50 higher, with most upturn on Choice. Cow beef 50-1.50 lower, except Commercial steady. Receipts 21,900 compared with 20,800 last week and 26,400 last year. Twelve market receipts 189,500 compared with (Continued on Page 3)
