

Area Holstein Herds Reported For Records

Brattleboro, Vermont—Local dairy herds of Registered Hol-

stein cows have established new lactation averages for milk and butterfat production. As reported by the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, the official production testing herd averages are:

Hiram S. Aungst, Elizabeth-

town, has 37 completed production records averaging 16,975 lbs. of milk and 686 lbs. of butterfat.

Elam Bollinger, Manheim, has 44 completed production records averaging 15,493 lbs of milk and 593 lbs. of butterfat.

John W. Eshelman & Sons, Red Rose Research Center, Lancaster, have 26 completed production records averaging 17,408 lbs of milk and 658 lbs. of butterfat.

Robert C. Groff, Groffdale

Farm, Quarryville, has 28 completed production records averaging 16,159 lbs. of milk and 601 lbs. of butterfat.

Titus M. Hurst, Lititz, has 36 completed production records averaging 16,368 lbs. of milk and 598 lbs of butterfat.

Robert H. Kauffman, Elizabethtown, has 45 completed production records averaging 15,763 lbs. of milk and 579 lbs. of butterfat.

Henry E. Kettering, Lititz, has 45 completed production records averaging 16,538 lbs. of milk and 651 lbs. of butterfat.

John E. Kreider, Lancaster, has 41 completed production records averaging 15,705 lbs of milk and 600 lbs of butterfat.

Harold M. Umble, Atglen, has 36 completed production records averaging 15,218 lbs. of milk and 580 lbs of butterfat.

To provide a uniform means of comparing Registered Holstein herd performance, lactation averages are reported on the industry standard, two milkings per day, 305-day, mature equivalent basis. These production levels compare favorably to the average U.S. cow's annual production of 8,513 lbs. of milk and 315 lbs of butterfat. Penn State University supervised the sampling and production testing procedures in cooperation with the official herd testing programs of the national Holstein Association.

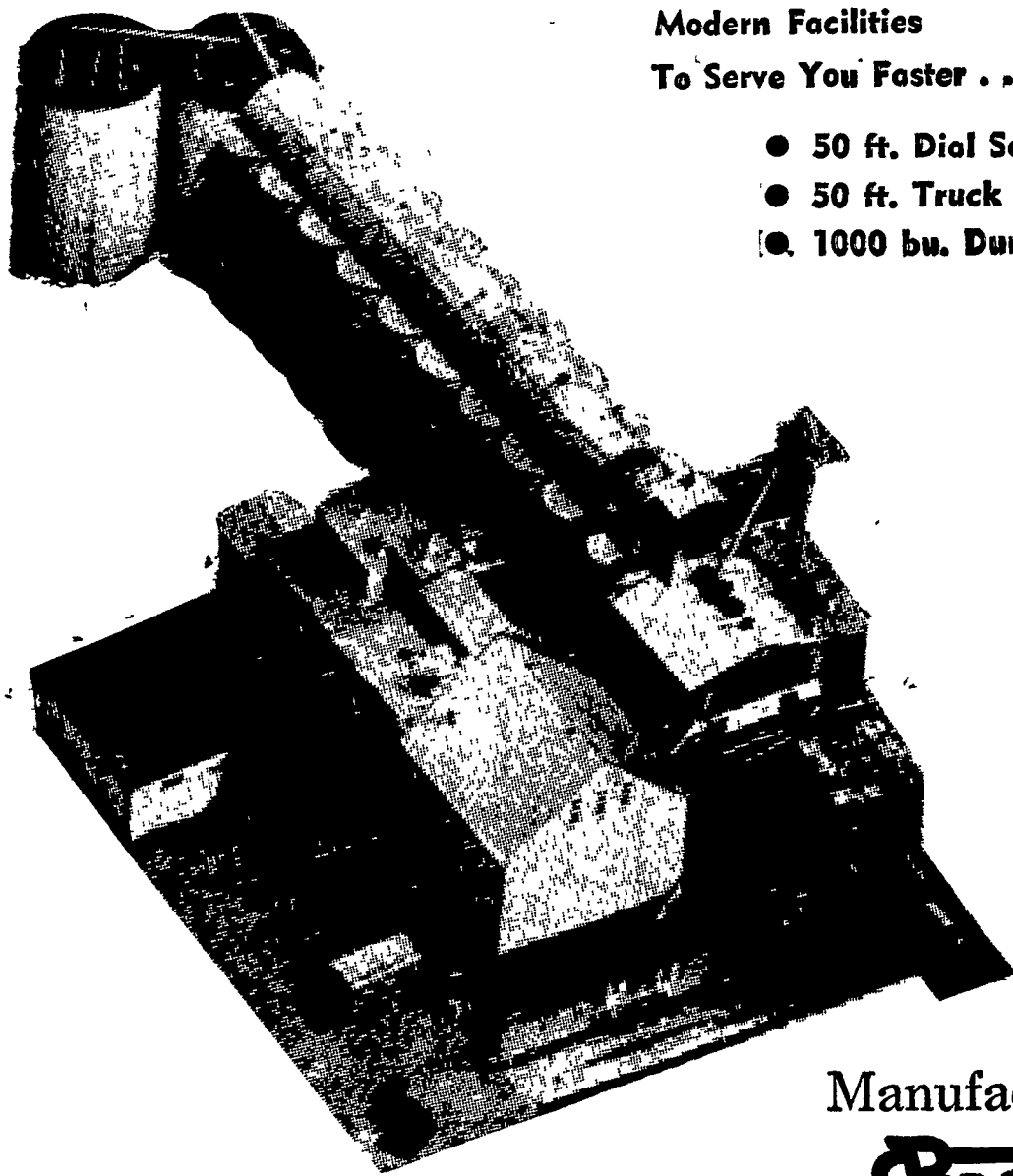
