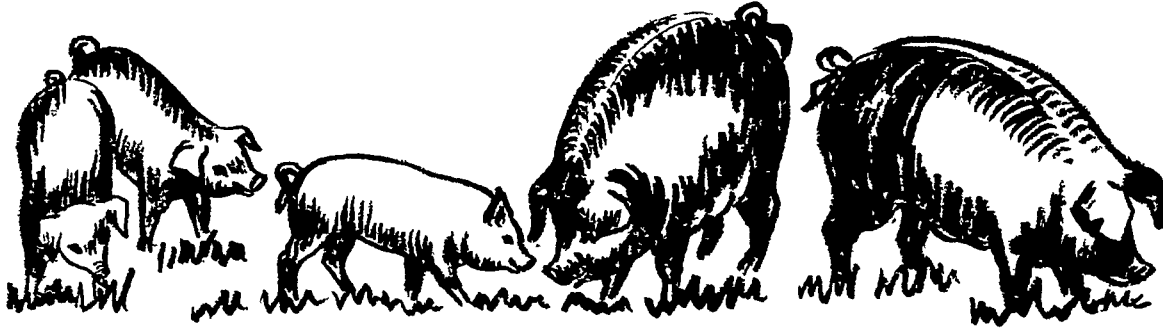
Donations of money were sent to the County Treasury for County Farm and Home kitchen and to the Society's Korean Child for her Christmas gift.
