Demand spotty as some plants curtailing running time while others in full operation during Holiday period. Offerings of heavy hens short of a fair call. Roasters and capons generally adequate for a good demand. Prices paid at farm: Light hens 3-4½, mostly 4-4½ c. Heavy Hens TFEWR.

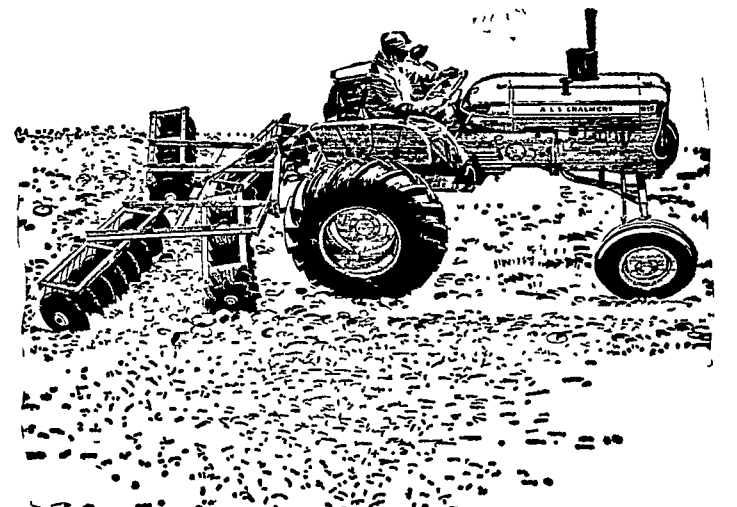
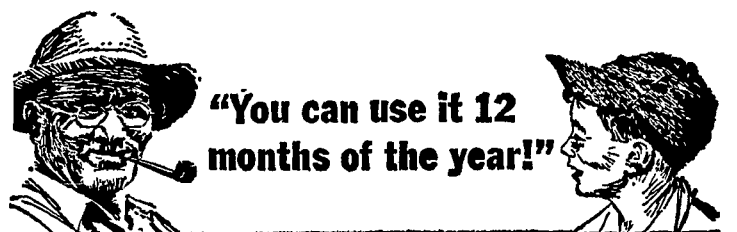
