Agriculture Teacher at the high school will teach welding in the various positions, on different kinds of metal, welding cast iron, hard surfacing, cutting, and brazing with an arc welding.

Everyone who attends will receive a certified diploma if they attend all five sessions. A fee of \$5.00 will be charged for the course and all materials needed

will be provided free of charge. The course is based on instruction developed by the Lincoln Electric Company who makes arc welding equipment and has been conducting welding schools since 1917. The Farmersville Equipment Co. will sponsor the course.

The welding school will be limited to twenty persons. Anyone interested in the course should contact the Agriculture Department of the Garden Spot High School by January 5, 1968.

qualities, the USDA last year compared the Lenape's yield and specific gravity to the performance of the standard Katahdin and Kennebec varieties. Taking an average from five test locations — Maine, North Carolina, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Texas — the results gave Lenape a clear lead in specific gravity over the other two varieties, while its mean yield per acre ran slightly under Kennebec's and considerably higher than Katahdin's.

The Lenape was developed from a cross of two USDA seedlings, 41756 and B3672-3. The first true seed was grown in 1959 under pedigree number B5141-6 at the Crops Research Division of the Agricultural Research Service at Beltsville, Md. In addition to the Wise Potato Chip Co., many State Experiment Stations cooperated with the USDA and the Pennsylvania Agricultural Experiment Station in its selection and development. Among the scientists mainly responsible for the success of the new variety are Dr. R. V. Akeley, potato investigation leader at the USDA facility at Beltsville, and Dr. W. R. Mills, professor of plant pathology at Penn State University.

Foundation seed of the Lenape potato is now being produced by the State Seed Potato Board of Maine. Seed potatoes for general use are expected to be available for the 1969 planting.
