The new 35-foot modular-type display utilizes a variety of unique and colorful visual presentations illustrating the Game Commission's various wildlife management programs and the many public services carried out by the state's Game Protectors, whose execution of Commission policies and programs have made Pennsylvania the leading hunting state in the nation

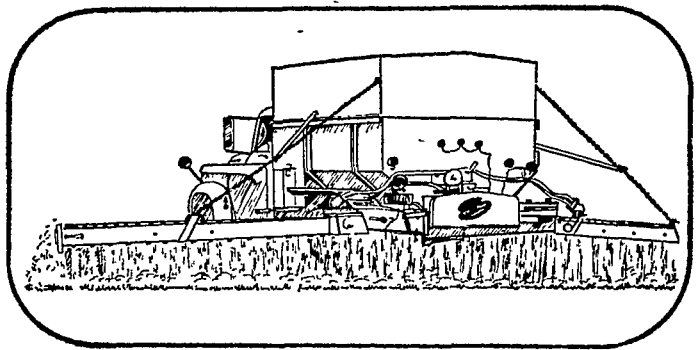
Also included in the display will be two live deer shown in simulated natural environment. Game Commission officers will be on duty at the exhibit to answer questions and provide

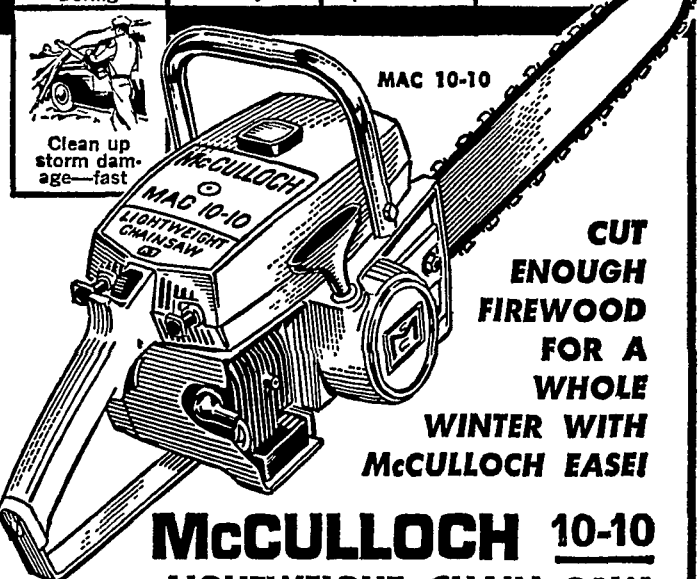
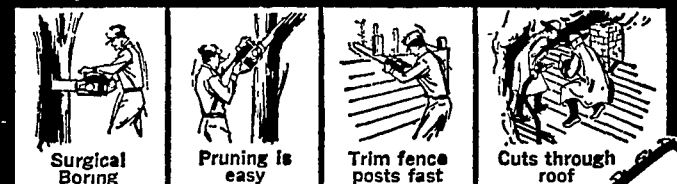
