

Kent Fritz Has Corn Yield Of 245 Bushels

HARRISBURG — For the first time in the 20-year history of the Pennsylvania One-Acre Corn Contest, four young persons produced yields of over 200 bushels of shelled corn per acre. Champions for 1967 were announced Tuesday night, during the annual corn growers banquet at the State Farm Show.

Kent Fritz, of Warwick High School, Lancaster County, had the highest yield of all champions with 245 bushels of shelled corn per acre in maturity group 3 for growers of medium to full-season hybrids. Second place in maturity group 3 went to Belinda Springman, of Muncy High School, Lycoming County, with 210 bushels per acre
