"Snowball" was a 350 pound bull calf when he wandered on to the Snyder farm 14 months ago. Repeated newspaper and radio advertising failed to locate the owner

Tony Dobrosky, assistant county fair agent in York County, suggested to John Snyder, owner of the 29 acre farm the bull calf decided to call home, that he let Steve raise it as a 4-H project

"Snowball" was "steerized" and has grown into 965 pounds of future steaks, roasts and hamburger.

The steer is the first animal Steve, who is a member of the Wellsville 4-H Club, has ever shown at the Farm Show

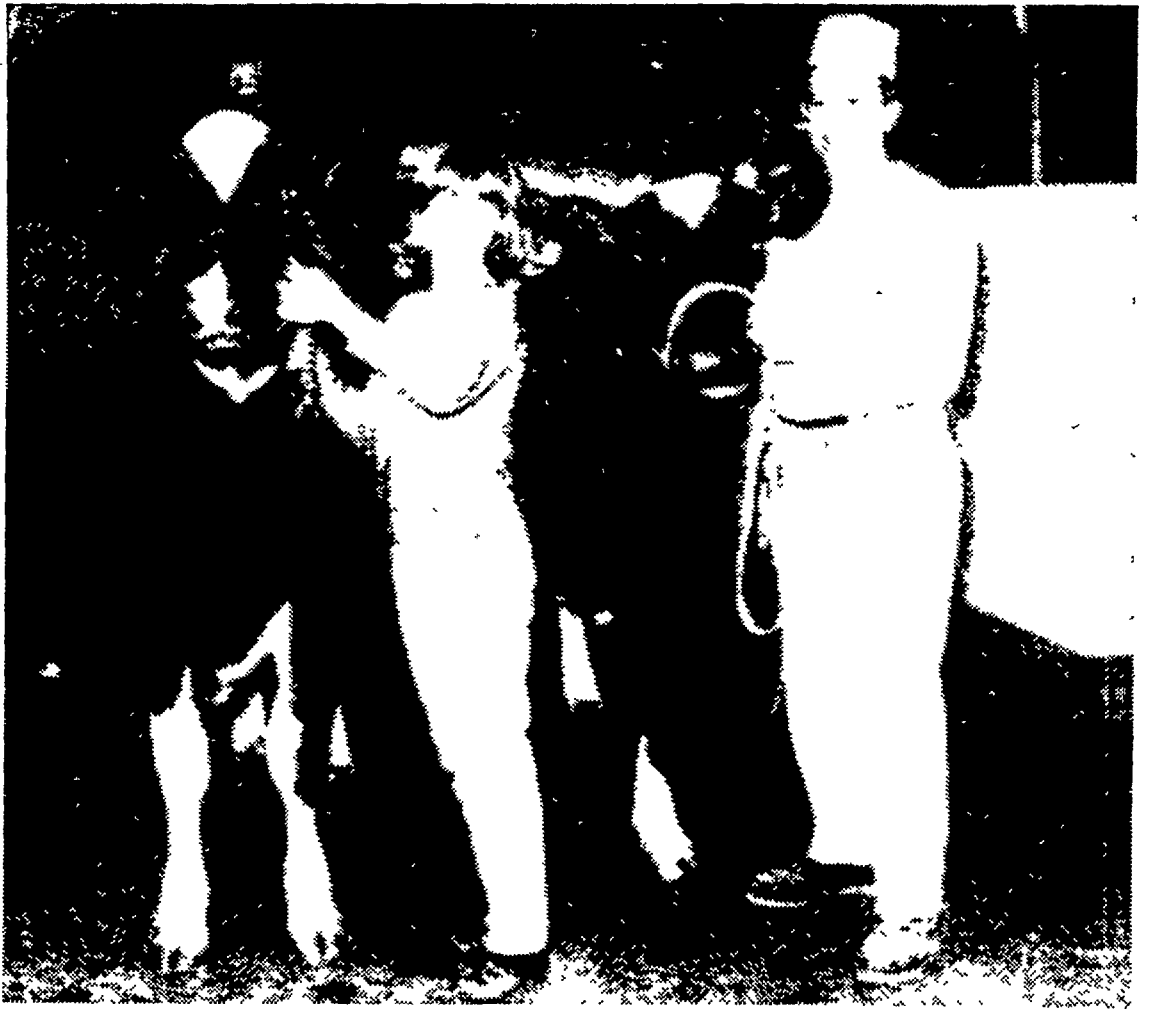
