LIVE HENS

Prices of both light and heavy hens held about unchanged in instances, lots of heavy type which average slightly below 7# brought down to 14c. Demand on light hens fair. Offerings were only adequate to occasionally barely adequate as some producers held flocks for further production at current egg prices or forced molted flocks that had declined in production because of the severe cold weather early in month. Heavy type demand fair for adequate offerings, paid at farm — Light hens 3½-5¼, Heavy hens 15-16c.

Agway Feeder Wins Top Egg Show Award!

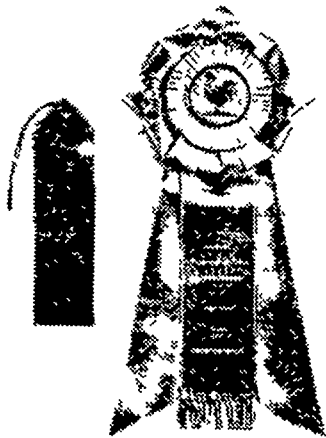

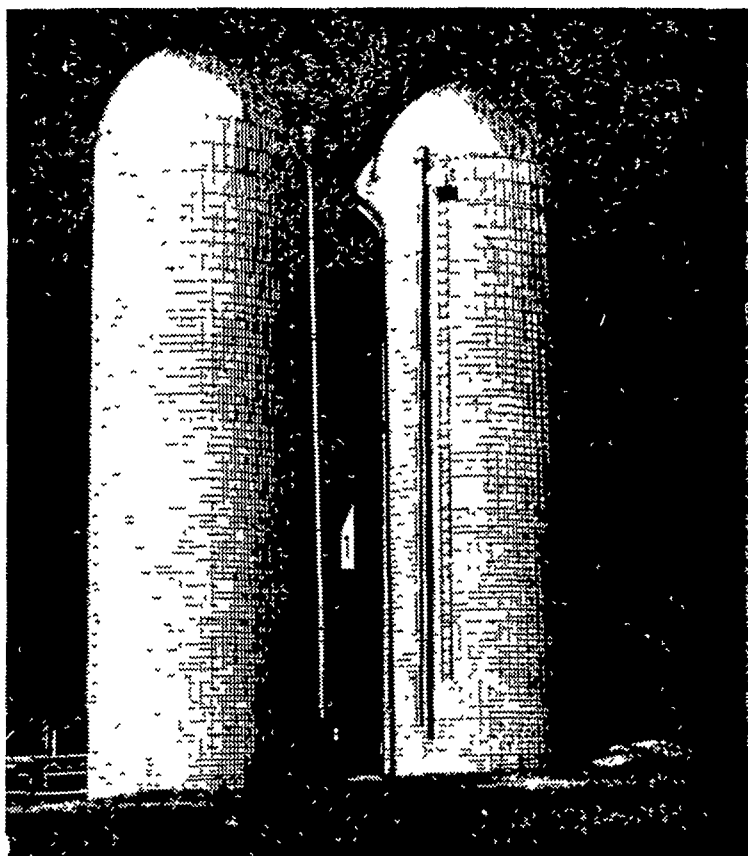
