expanding one. While there will be fewer and bigger farms in the future, as there are fewer and bigger passenger airplanes—the backup crews, all the related agri-business occupations will continue to employ more than one-third of the total work force in this nation.

"I am not here today to attempt to interest you in the production part of agriculture. I am here to try to interest you in the merchandizing and promotion side of agriculture because you do not know how to sell. You don't know how to merchandize. Today you must communicate or there will be no tomorrow," Gartley said.

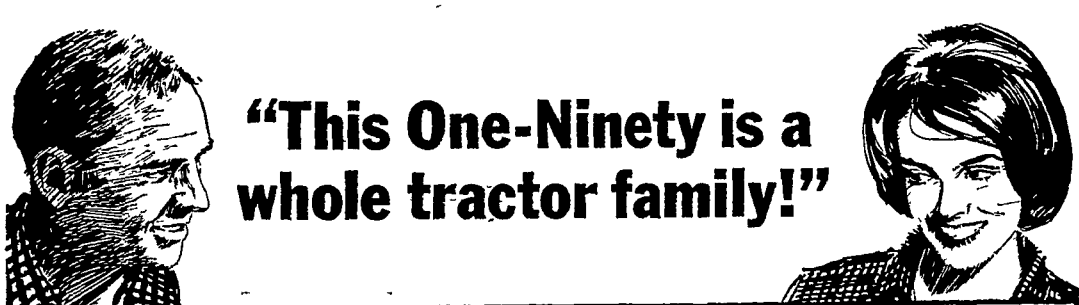

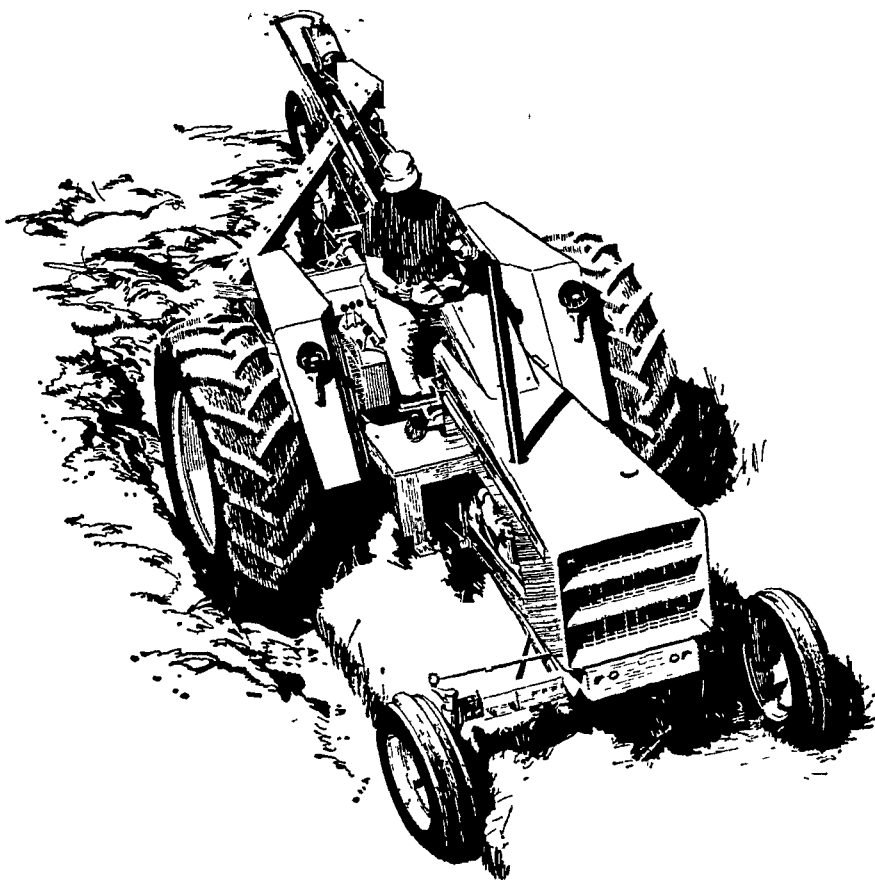
