- 1 cup milk
 - ¾ cup sifted flour
 - 1 tablespoon sugar
 - ¼ teaspoon salt
 - ¼ cup semi-sweet chocolate pieces, melted
- Cherry Sauce:
- 1 can (1 lb., 1 oz.) sweet-pitted cherries, drained
 - ½ cup water
 - ¼ to ½ cup sugar
 - 1 tablespoon cornstarch
 - 2 tablespoons margarine
 - 2 tablespoons lemon juice

In a small mixing bowl, beat eggs well Add milk Mix until smooth. Sift together flour, sugar, and salt Add to egg mixture and beat into a smooth batter Blend in chocolate. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour Pour about 2 tablespoons batter for each crepe on a lightly buttered, heated grill Bake 2 to 3 minutes per side.

Cut ice cream into 1 inch slices. Divide each slice into 3 strips. Place a strip in the center of each crepe. Fold sides around ice cream so it is well enclosed. Place on a pan in freezer until ready to serve.

To Make Cherry Sauce: In a small saucepan, combine cherries, ¼ cup water, and sugar. Bring cherry mixture to a rapid boil. Add remaining water to cornstarch; blend to a smooth paste. Add to cherry mixture. Continue to cook, stirring constantly, until thick and clear, about 5 minutes. Remove from heat. Add margarine and lemon juice. Serve hot sauce over 2 individual crepes per serving Makes 8 servings (2 crepes each)

NOTE: Remove ice cream filled crepes from freezer approximately 10 minutes prior to serving.

People Eating More Meat

In 1967, the average American ate 105 pounds of beef, 63 pounds of pork, 4 pounds of veal, and 4 pounds of lamb for a total of 176 pounds. That's 15 pounds more than in 1960, according to Harold E. Neigh, Penn State extension consumer economics specialist. Since 1960, consumption figures for beef have increased 20 pounds while pork, veal, and lamb have each declined about 2 pounds.
