- Under the feed grain program, diversion payments on the broad line of famous Oliver, the larger farms will be made on acreage withheld from corn or grain sorghum production above the qualifying 20 percent of the base. This additional diversion may total up to 50 percent of the base, or 25 acres, whichever is larger. The diversion payment rate per acre will be 45 percent of the total local price support (county loan rate plus the price-support payment) times the yield. (The total local price-support in Lancaster


