

# Pennsylvania To Have A Dairy Princess In 1968

The Pennsylvania Dairy Princess Contest Committee announced that the 12th Pennsylvania Dairy Princess Contest will be held in 1968.

William C. Nichol, chairman of the 1968 Pennsylvania Dairy Princess Contest, said, the decision was made to have the contest in 1968 and this action re-creates the largest "Agricultural Queen" contest in the state. Nichol added that the Dairy Princess Contest is "befitting the state's largest farm industry." Everyone in the dairy industry should promote the 1968 Dairy Princess Contest.

From 1956 through 1962 it was called the Miss Milkmaid Contest. In 1963 the title was changed to Pennsylvania Dairy Princess Contest to tie in with the national contest, the American Dairy Princess Contest.

The Dairy Princess Contest was begun for two main reasons:

1. To promote the industry-wide contribution of the milk business to the nutrition and

economy of Pennsylvania.

2. To promote interindustry cooperation and understanding between various segments of the Pennsylvania dairy industry. The local and state Dairy Princess travel around the state making appearances before industry and non-industry groups, on news media, at county fairs and festivals, etc., "speaking up for milk."

All contestants must have a dairying background so the Dairy Princess is a true representative of the entire dairy industry. The Pennsylvania Dairy Princess represents the state in the American Dairy Princess Contest.

The impact and statewide interest in the Contest can be traced through the state titlists and the growing number of contestants each year.

### Contest Information

1. Local contests may be held any time during the summer prior to August 15
2. Actual supervision and staging of the local contest will be the responsibility of the local committee.
3. Entry in the state contest must be submitted to the Bureau of Markets, Agricultural Building, Harrisburg, Pa., no later than August 15
4. The state contest will be held in conjunction with the Penna. All-American Dairy Show at Harrisburg, September 25-26
5. Scheduling of the State Princess will be handled through the

Bureau of Markets, Agricultural Building, Harrisburg, Pa.

6. Each entry in the state contest will be accompanied by a \$50.00 fee payable to the Pennsylvania Dairy Federation

7. The State Princess Committee will designate a chaperone who will accompany the State Princess on every occasion unless the requesting organization furnishes a responsible chaperone.

8. The Atlantic Dairy Association will be responsible for the appearance of the State Princess and chaperone at the National Contest

### Contestants must:

1. Be the daughter of a dairying family producing milk in Pennsylvania.
2. Live in Pennsylvania
3. Be at least 17, and not reach 25 before June 1, 1968
4. Be a high school graduate before June 30, 1968.
5. Have parent's or guardian's consent if under 21
6. Be single and never married
7. Appear at the local contest
8. Appear at State finals if selected as local contest winner
9. Former local and state winners are not eligible
