National Holstein Assn. States 4-Point Program

Robert H. Rumler, executive secretary of the Holstein-Friesian Association of America, has issued the association's official position on the threat of imitation and filled milks. Parts of that statement are as follows:

Once again our dairy industry faces a crisis. As a matter of fact, filled milk and imitation milk present one of the most formidable challenges dairymen have faced in the long and rath-

er hectic history of the industry in our country. Unlike other crises, filled milk and imitation milk have the potential for eroding the very foundation of the industry. Whole milk and fluid milk products presently constitute 49 percent of the end use of milk production and provide the economic foundation under the major segment of the dairy industry.

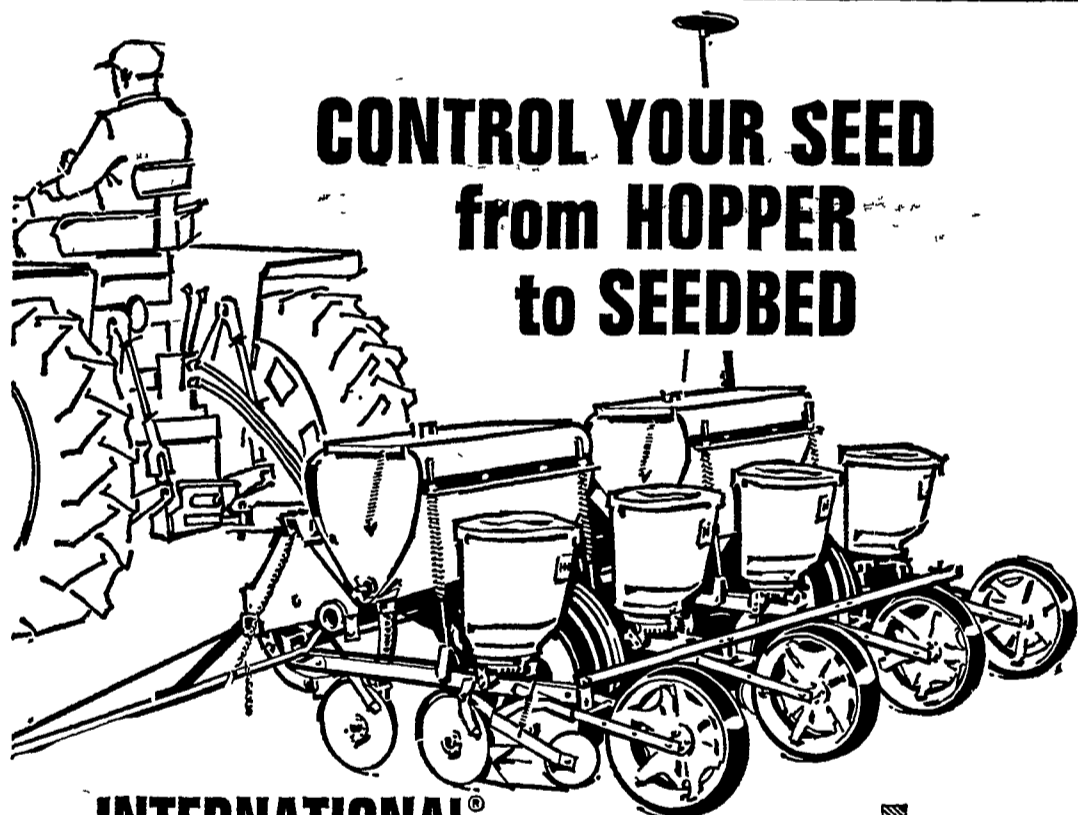
