March 19 - Insect and Insect
Damage Identification. The
study will be confined to those
insects attacking CORN, HAY,
and TOBACCO. Many of you
have had reduced yields in these
crops and are not aware of the
amount of damage done. Speak-
er: Dr. Henry Menusen, Extension
Agronomist, Penn State
University.

March 26 - Latest Control
Recommendations. Study again
will center around controlling in-
sects in CORN, HAY, and TO-
BACCO. Latest developments
and recommendations will be
presented. If time permits, a
short questioning period on weed
control will be held in order to
take advantage of the fine re-
source speaker Speaker Mr.
John M. Beideman, Geigy Agric.
Chemicals.

April 2 - Safe Application of
Insecticides. This class will cover
the dangers, precautions,
and safe handling of insecti-
cides during the first part and
calibration and proper adjust-
ment of spraying equipment,
during the second half of meet-
