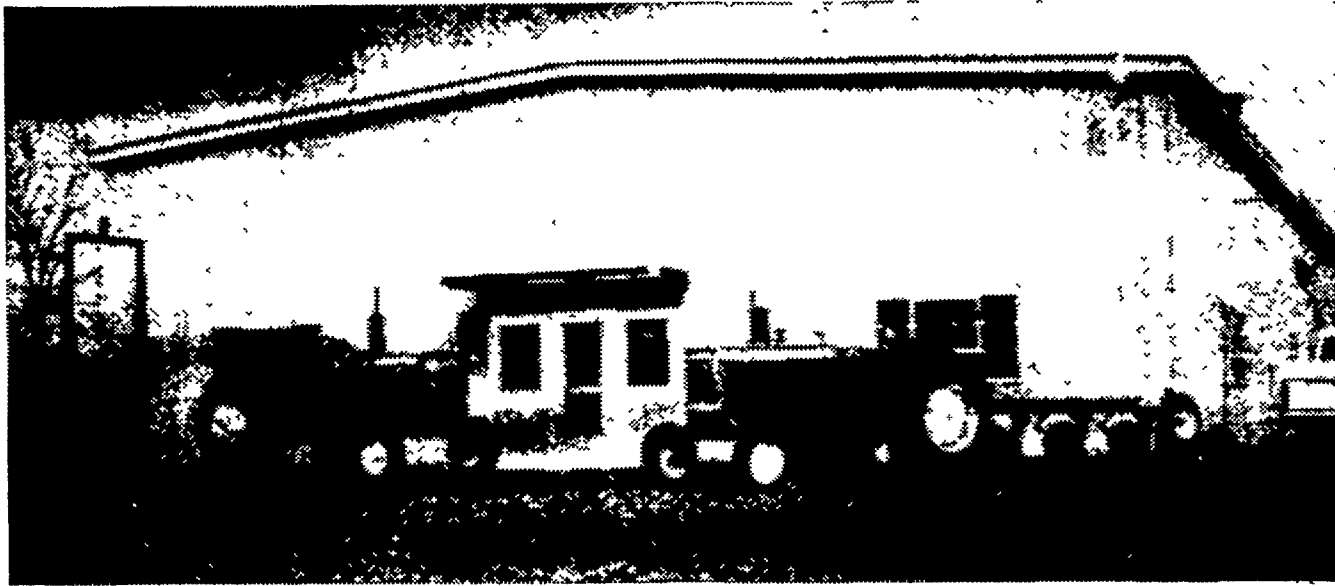

Sportsmen Re-organize In Lititz

After a year of re-organization, the Lititz Sportsmen's Association is back in full operation. And to prove the fact, they will be holding their annual Ox-Roast, a Lititz tradition since the mid-1930's, on Thursday, March 28 at the Lititz Community Center.

High-lighting this year's program will be a presentation by big game hunter, George Yocum Jr., of Reading. Yocum, who is a factory sales representative for W. R. Weaver Co., makers of Weaver gun scopes, has hunted in Africa, Alaska, Canada, Mexico and most of the United States. On his most recent safari to Tanzania Province, Africa, he bagged the infamous "Big Five", which means Lion, Cape Buffalo, Elephant, Leopard and Rhinoceros.

An amateur photographer and avid sportsman, Yocum will show home movies of his last African trip, complete with personal commentary.

The meal will be served at 6:30 p.m., and the program, which is to include door-prizes valued at more than \$300, will begin immediately after the meal. An event for members of the association, the officers will have memberships for sale at the door. Cost of membership is \$2.00 and the meal is priced at one dollar.

Local and statewide conservation and sporting officials along with local contributors to the sportsmanship programs of the association will be honored guests at the event.

Podiatry Is Included By Pa. Blue Shield

CAMP HILL, PA — Pennsylvania Blue Shield benefits will be broadened at no additional cost to most members to include many podiatry (chiroprody) services, it was announced today by Matthew K. Gale, president of the state-wide health care financing plan. Payment for the new benefits becomes effective on March 1.

The podiatry benefits become part of most Blue Shield agreements on March 1. Members covered under experience-rated master contracts will have the new benefits as their contracts are renegotiated.

Cost of the broadened coverage will be defrayed from Blue Shield reserves which have been accumulated over the years to provide additional benefits to members as further professional services are made available and are desired by the members, Mr. Gale said.

Podiatry services to be covered by Blue Shield include the following: incision and drainage of infected tissues of the foot, removal of lesions of the foot, removal of infected toenails and treatment of fractures and dislocations of bones of the foot.

Services excluded from coverage include: procedures considered to be a part of routine foot care, such as treatment of corns, bunions and calluses; non-surgical care of toenails, fallen arches and other symptomatic complaints of the feet, except where surgery is performed.
