LIVE HENS — Prices of both light and heavy hens held unchanged. Demand generally good on both types and readily clearing available supplies. Offerings of light type barely adequate for needs as producers hold for further egg production prior to Holiday period. Offerings for movement following Eastern often heavy, heavy type offerings generally short of interest in most quarters. Prices paid at farm: light hens 4-6, mostly 5½-6, heavy hens 16-18c

TURKEYS — Limited trading noted on small lots moving to the retail ice-packed trade. Advance interest for Easter needs fair. Limited trading reported ranging from 22-28c depending on weights and quality of birds.

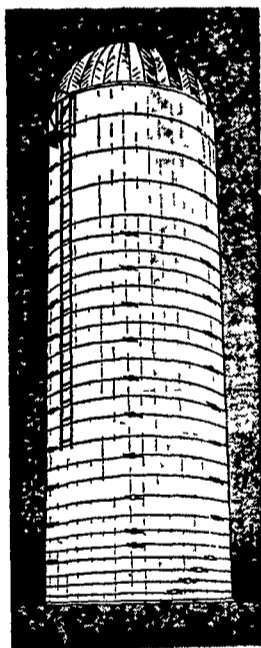
