

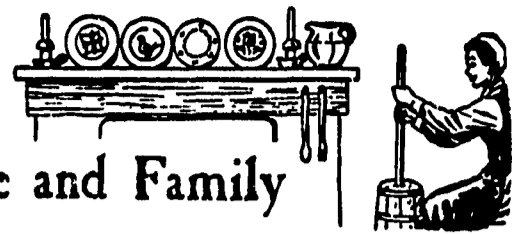

Children Outgrow Annoying Habits

Many irritating habits of children are normal results of their stages of development. Thumbsucking, picky eating, and even grabby hands are habits that will disappear as the child grows, whether you nag about them or not.

Purchase Fabric And Pattern At Same Time
When making your clothes, purchase the pattern and fabric at the same time. If this is impossible, choose the pattern first, selecting a design that's right for your figure, personality, and wardrobe.

Illustrations on the front of the pattern envelope and lists on the back of the envelope are helpful in choosing the right fabric for the design

Your best source of designs in fashion is to study current fashion trends in magazines, newspapers, and window displays.

Whatever the fashion look, the fabric and pattern should tell the story. For example, softness in design means softness in fabric. Patterns with firm, determined lines or architectural lines and seaming require fabrics which will support the shape

Careful study of the fabric can help you understand how it will perform when you have the garment made

What Is Steak?

Technically, steak refers to a cut of meat that's usually cut thinner than a roast. Steak may range from 1 to 2 inches thick.

Steaks include the less tender chuck — either blade or arm — or round. You will probably braise, not broil, these cuts.

Flank is another steak from a less tender cut of beef. Unless you use a meat tenderizer, it's a good idea to cook flank steak with moist heat

Check the price per pound of various steaks and determine the cost per serving. The less (Continued on Page 21)

The program was on safety and the speaker was Chester Fasig, Lancaster Detective. His subject was "Prowlers".

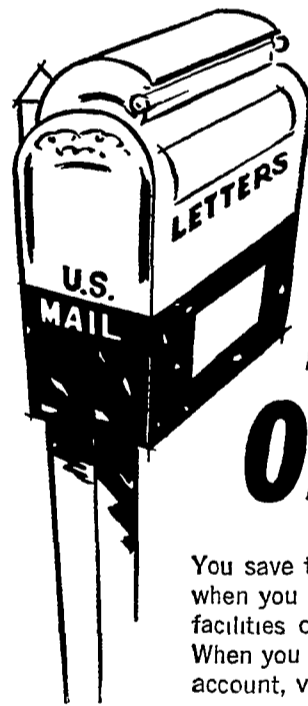
Five members volunteered to be waitresses at the Heart Haven Bazaar in April. The Society is planning a bus trip to
