February Milk Earns Dairy Farmers \$5.21

Dairy farmers will receive a uniform farm price of \$5.21 per hundredweight (46.5 quarts) for February milk deliveries to pool handlers in the New York - New Jersey milkshed. It was recently announced. This was the same price paid in January; \$5.05 was paid in February, 1967.

The producer butterfat differential was computed at six cents for each tenth of a pound of fat above or below the 3.5 percent standard.

Receipts from producers totaled 791,696,070 pounds, a drop of 70,521,561 pounds, or 8.2 percent, from the same month last year. A J Pollard, market administrator, reported. Sales of fluid milk (Class I) were down 11,737,149 pounds, or 2.7 percent, to 419,936,064 pounds.

Class I milk accounted for 53 percent of the pool, compared to 50.1 percent in February, 1967. Dr. Pollard said. Handlers paid \$6.11 per hundredweight for milk received in the 201-210 mile zone and sold as fluid.

The administrator pointed out that there were 3,952 fewer producers than last year but the number with bulk tanks increased by 363. Receipts from 30,592 dairymen were pooled, of whom 13,476 had tanks.

Average deliveries per day per producer increased by one pound to 892 pounds, he said. The number of handlers' reports used dropped by 35 to 208.

Receipts at bulk tank units increased 13,911,966 pounds to 495,605,141 pounds, Dr. Pollard said. Tank milk comprised 62.6 percent of the pool, the percentage last year was 55.9.

There were 46 fewer units than last year, or a total of 270. The number of plants dropped by 61 to 231.

The farm value of February's milk was \$41,767,035.82. Dr. Pollard explained that this figure does not include all the differentials paid to dairy farmers.

The uniform farm price of \$5.21 per hundredweight will be paid for milk testing 3.5 percent butterfat and received within 201-210 miles of New York City.
