In one study, scientists at the Pennsylvania State University, working under an ARS research grant, are concentrating on the precursors of two groups of components that affect flavor of

These two groups are called methyl ketones and lactones Dr Paul Dimick and Penn State associates are interested in the mechanism by which cows produce the precursors of these methyl ketones and lactones Their studies indicate that these compounds are synthesized in the cow's mammary gland when certain fatty acids become attached to glycerol molecules to form glycerides, or fats. If these fatty acids are separated by heat from their parent glycerol, apparently they are quickly converted to methyl ketones and lactones, which are readily detectable by the off-flavors they cause.

(Fatty acids that combine with a glycerol to form the precursors of ketones are called beta-keto acids; those that combine with a glycerol to form the precursors of lactones are called gamma- and delta-hydroxy fatty acids)

By reserving a prefix, a Holstein dairyman establishes a "trade mark" which is used in all published information conerning the performance of his cattle. It becomes the first part of the name of every animal bred in the herd.

The origin of prefix names often stems from farm names, family name combinations or unique geographical or historical features of the farmstead. Members of the immediate fam-


ily of the person for whom the prefix is recorded may also be allowed to use the prefix when the herd is a single unit.

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


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
