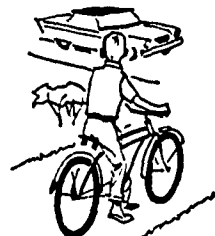

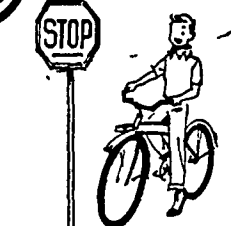

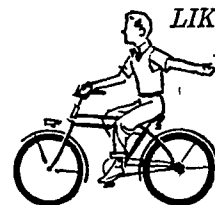


Look before you leap Remember, vehicles in the street have the right of way. Don't barge out of driveways or lanes until you are sure no cars are coming.



Observe all traffic signs Stop where cars do. Go only on the green light... and only in the direction arrows point on One-Way streets.

Use directional signals Point with hand and arm in the direction you will turn before you turn.



Inspect for safety Check your bike regularly for brakes, safe tires, tight seat and handlebars, operating headlight and bell or horn.

Bicycle Safety Week Proclaimed April 10-17

Governor Raymond P. Shafer will proclaim April 10 through 17 to be Bicycle Safety Week in Pennsylvania. During this week a statewide bike safety campaign will be waged throughout the Commonwealth.

The campaign will be aimed at urging parents to take the time to teach bike safety to their children.

Commissioner Harry H. Brainerd of the Pennsylvania Bureau of Traffic Safety said the purpose of the Bicycle Safety Proclamation is to encourage motorists and cyclists alike to be cautious in the warm weather months ahead.

Police Chief George Hicks calls attention to drivers to adjust their driving habits to be alert for the mistakes youngsters on their bikes sometimes make.

Chief Hicks also reminds the children to ride their bikes in a safe manner. The following rules should be followed by all bike riders.

1. Only one person permitted on a bike at a time.
2. Bikes are not to be ridden on the sidewalk.
3. Obey all rules of the road.
4. Use directional hand signals.
5. Reflectors and head lamps are required on bikes ridden after dark.

Children are reminded to keep their bikes in good working condition. Here are a few bicycle safety tips to be remembered: A broken chain can mean a nasty fall and even a serious injury. To prevent this, the chain should be checked for weak spots and repaired. Tires on bikes require the same attention as those on cars. Tire pressures should be checked periodically and inspected for worn spots and breaks in the sidewall.

Improperly adjusted bicycle seats may result in serious accidents if the rider cannot reach the pedals adequately. The bike a child rides should fit him.

The time to teach your child bicycle safety is now. Make it a special project as a "personal" observance of "Bicycle Safety Week" being observed now!

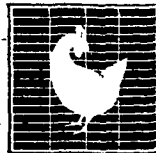
