We know you'll find these 1 tempting tuna dishes as satisfying as they are quick and easy 1 to prepare.

QUICK SKILLET TUNA SUPPER

- 1/4 cup chopped green onions and stems
- cup snipped fresh parsley tablespoons butter or mar-
- cups cooked rice (regular or instant)
- can (6½ or 7-oz.) chunk style tuna, drained
- eggs, slightly beaten
- teaspoon grated lemon peel tablespoons lemon juice
- oup grated Cheddar cheese Garlic salt
