see fox tracks all around here. And if you follow them, like he does in the snow, they often lead into a neighboring farm yard or past the farm house. Watson showed us a last year's hole just inside the timberline of a pine grove where he and his dogs dug out a litter of ten baby foxes.

And time and again he pointed out evidence that foxes had been present—like a riddled nest of rabbit fur or fox manure filled with feathers. This evidence would go unnoticed to the inexperienced eye.

We saw several deleted "No Hunting" signs, put up for last fall's small game hunters. But these signs usually don't mean Walter and his dogs. Many farmers know him and welcome him in their fields and woods to eradicate the foxes. Also, the foxhounds will not disturb or even be distracted by a rabbit or pheasant. We saw lots of them Monday morning, but the dogs didn't seem to notice. They have their own job to do—catch

ticular container in which the milk is delivered. This reflects anticipated savings for larger and less frequent deliveries," Chairman Huber continued.

"The Commission has taken into consideration the costs of various types of containers, and the new schedule reflects this fact. Milk purchased in plastic non-reusable containers will cost 1-cent per quart equivalent more than the minimum established prices for milk in other types of containers," Mr. Huber continued.

"However, the new adjustments in consumer prices encourages quantity and less frequent purchases both at homes and from stores. The Commission hopes that consumers will adjust their buying habits to take advantage of anticipated economies in distribution which should tend to stabilize minimum resale milk prices," Mr. Huber concluded.

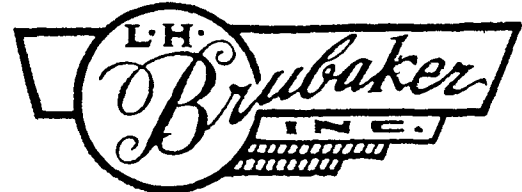
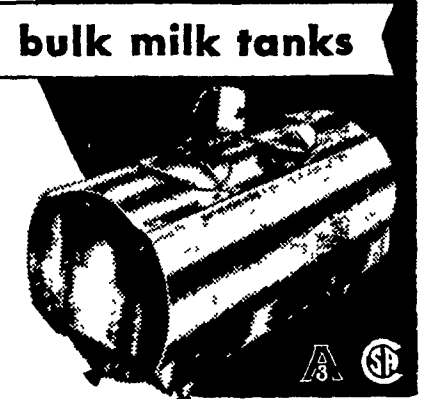
