Courses



Small trees bearing showy flowers in spring or summer have come into recent favor with do-it-yourself home landscapers. Colorful fruits and foliage add to their value.

According to a Pennsylvania State University correspondence course on trees for home landscaping, dogwoods, crabapples and hawthorns make excellent plants around small homes.

Dogwoods bloom in early May with white to red flowers depending on their variety. Their red, berrylike fruits and scarlet foliage are showy in autumn. They seldom grow over 20 feet tall.

Crabapples bloom in mid-May

with white, pink or red, five-petaled flowers. Their fruits vary in color from yellow to orange, red and almost purple, depending on variety, and are quite attractive during autumn. Some varieties have fruits that hang on into winter, making good bird feed.

Blooming in late May are the hawthorns with white, pink or scarlet flowers followed by orange, scarlet or red fruits one-half inch in diameter. They're dense, twiggy trees with thorns 1 to 2 inches long. The thick growth with thorns and fruits make excellent bird cover and food.

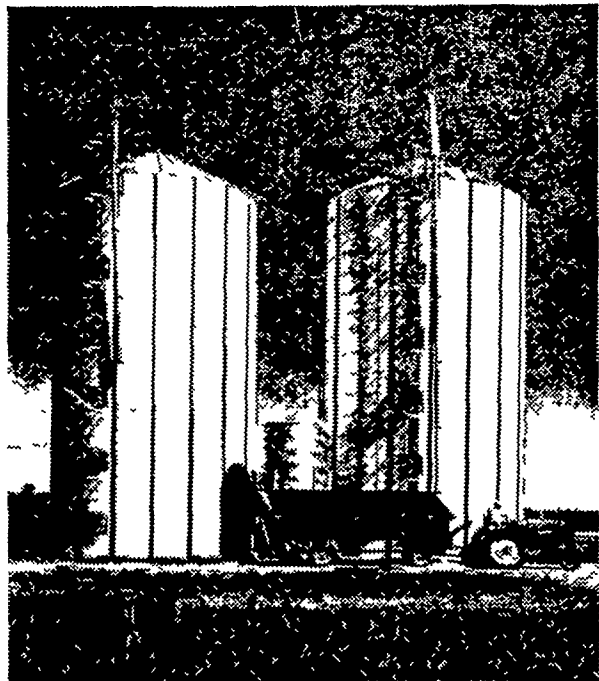
