State Calf Sale Average Is \$345.03 On 156 Head; Top \$670

One hundred forty-one consignors from 36 counties participated in the recent Pennsylvania Holstein Association State Calf Sale at Harrisburg. New records were established as the 156 calves averaged \$345.03 with a top of \$670 for an entry from the Robert L. Stoich farm, Troy, Pennsylvania.

Heading the list of buyers was the firm of W. H. Waldman and Gerald Reedy, Chandler, Oklahoma, who made 71 purchases.

Nearly 50 of the calves were purchased as project animals by 4-H and FFA members in Penn-

sylvania. The remainder went to dairymen who are changing from grade to Registered Holsteins, or to established registered breeders desiring to im-

The fact that 68 of the consignments sold for \$370 or more was an indication local Holstein club officers who made the selections made sure their county was well represented according to Association Secretary, William C. Nichol.

Enrollment Begun For NEPPCO Egg School

Enrollment has started for the 37th NEPPCO Egg Quality School to be held on the campus of the University of Maryland, College Park, Md., from June 16th through the 20th, reports Dr. C. E. Howes, head of the Poultry Science Department of Virginia Polytechnic Institute who is Director of the NEPPCO school.

"We have again revised the school's curriculum to include

instruction and practice in all the newest techniques and procedures — not only related to quality in shell eggs, but to liquid, frozen, dried and further processed egg products as well," Dr. Howes said.

The course includes three days of classroom and laboratory work, plus a written and practical examination. Certificates are awarded to those who pass the course. Over the years, these certificates have frequently earned advancements for those who held them.

"There are no formal education requirements for those desiring to enroll," Dr. Howes emphasized. "In the past, we have had many students who successfully completed the course with no more than a grade school education. Nor is age a barrier. Our students have ranged in age from the late teens to 60 or over. And each year we have a half dozen or more women enrolled as well as a few students from other countries. So when we talk about students, we are
