The people with the answers will be contacted, and while I cannot promise complete satisfaction in every case, you may be assured that each problem will get full consideration.

A telephone call to either of the Congressional offices is another method of expressing your opinion or finding out mine. If I should not be available to talk with you when the call is placed, the staff will make a complete record of your opinion or request and will pass it along to me.

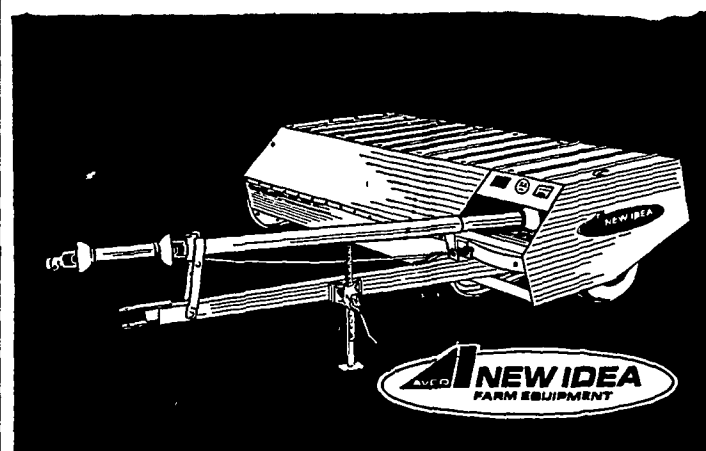
They have this show each year (open to the public) to raise funds to continue the club in-
