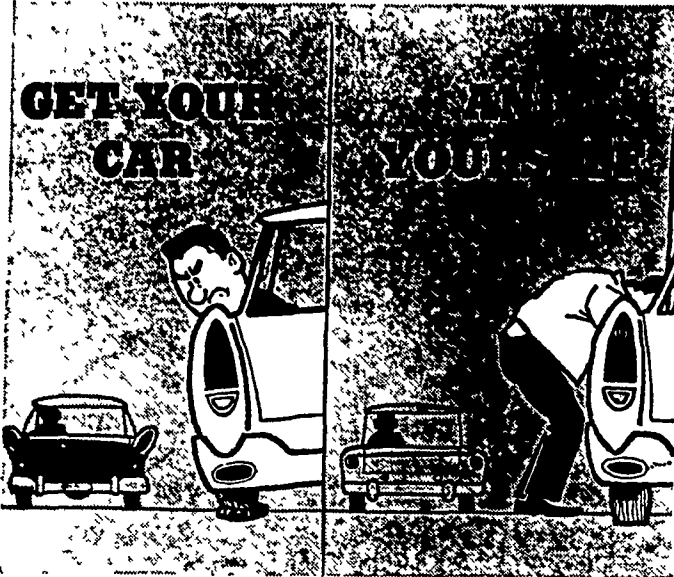

### Wheat Quotas Questioned By Farmers Member

The Federal government wheat program was questioned in Harrisburg recently at a meeting called by ASCS to consider wheat quotas for the 1969 wheat crop.

"Maybe, it is time for a change," testified Warren Lamm, a Pennsylvania Farmers' Association board member. "Because the wheat program now being conducted by the federal government has not helped the farmer to increase his income

by Secretary Freeman in 1966 resulted in reduced prices for farmers and increased wheat stock carry-over," Lamm stated. "We recommend that in projecting 1969 wheat allotments that a realistic evaluation be made of wheat utilization, both at home and abroad. Let's not have another season like 1967."

The meeting had been called to consider quotas for the 1969 wheat crop in the three state area of New York, Maryland and Pennsylvania. Secretary Freeman has called a series of meetings across the country similar to the Harrisburg session.

Lamm charged that the price of wheat was not only hurt last year, but severe damage was caused to the entire feed grain market

## Pa. Parks Within Easy Driving Distance

Pennsylvania's State Parks not only have everything but they can be found, along with a large array of facilities, within easy travelling distance from any of the Commonwealth's great metropolitan areas.

In fact, a spot check of any official highway map will reveal one or more State Parks located within an hour's drive from such large cities as Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Erie, Allentown, Scranton, Harrisburg, York, Lancaster and Altoona.

For example approximately 25 miles to the west of Pittsburgh is Raccoon Creek State Park, north is McConnell's Mill, to the northeast is Crooked Creek, and almost due east is Keystone State Park. Slightly beyond the radius is Ryerson Station State Park, to the southwest, which will be officially opened on Saturday, May 25.

Erie has its Presque Isle State Park, a popular retreat for fishermen, pleasure boaters, picnickers and bathers.

Altoona is located in the midst

of several State Parks with Prince Gallitzin off to the north-west, Curwensville to the north and, proceeding in a clock-wise manner: Black Moshannon, Whipple Dam, Greenwood Furnace, Trough Creek, Warriors Path, Shawnee and Blue Knob.

Less than 45 minutes from Harrisburg and York is the Gifford Pinchot State Park, due west of Harrisburg are Colonel Denning and Big Spring State Parks, while to the northeast is Memorial Lake at Intiantown Gap.

Almost midway between Lancaster and York is the S.S. Lewis State Park, near Wrightsville; in Lancaster County, one will find the Susquehanna State Park, overlooking the Susquehanna River; and northeast of Lancaster is French Creek, a popular camping, bathing and fishing area.

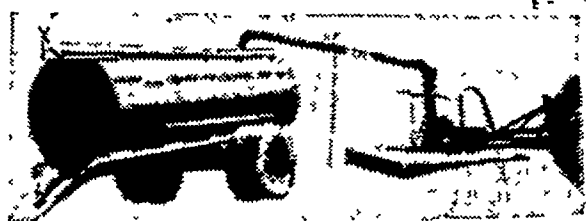
French Creek isn't too far from Allentown and to the north will be found Hickory Run and Big Pocono; while within a 30 mile

radius of Philadelphia is the Ralph Stover State Park.

In the northeastern section of the state, in the Scranton area, set a course in almost any direction and in less than an hour you'll find yourself at the threshold of several parks all offering a variety of outdoor recreational facilities.

To the northeast is Pothole and Prompton, due east is Promised Land and to the southeast is Tobyhanna, Gouldsboro and Big Pocono. Directly south is Hickory Run and to the west is Ricketts Glen.

These are but a few of the 156 outdoor recreational areas administered by the Department of Forests and Waters but are proof enough that its no longer necessary to spend several hot, dusty, weary hours on the road before arriving at some serene, pleasant, tree shaded picnic camping or bathing area for a bit of relaxation away from the daily routine.

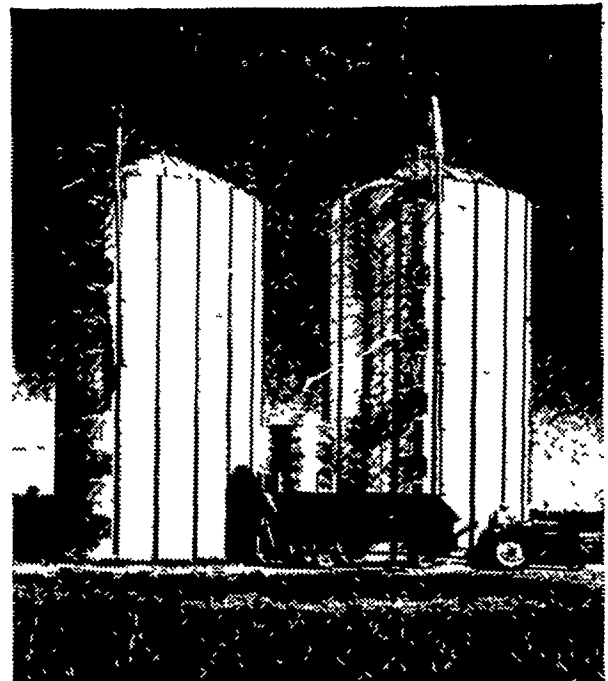
