

Local 4-H Youth Wins Conservation Award

Jeffrey N. Pfautz, 15, of Stevens R1, is among 21 Commonwealth 4-H Club members that have been named regional winners in the 1967-68 4-H Conservation Awards program and will

participate in a three-day tour of agricultural and conservation facilities in southwestern Pennsylvania, June 25-27.

Announcement of the selection was made today by Edward A. Mintmier, assistant State 4-H leader at The Pennsylvania State University, coordinator for the

State 4-H Conservation program.

"Regional winners came from 21 counties and were judged on the basis of individual project work in their local clubs," Mintmier said. "They were selected from among the 3,000 members who participate in the state conservation project".

Jeff is a member of the Northern 4-H Soil and Water Conservation Club, which was awarded the second place state award in project work during 1967-68. Local leaders are Aaron Stauffer of Ephrata R1 and Leroy Pfautz and Paul Martin, both of Stevens R1.

The tour and awards program is sponsored by the Pennsylvania Association of Soil and Water Conservation District Directors, in cooperation with the Cooperative Extension Service, State Soil and Water Conservation Commission, and U.S. Soil Conservation Service. Funds for the awards program are provided by the Sears, Roebuck Foundation.

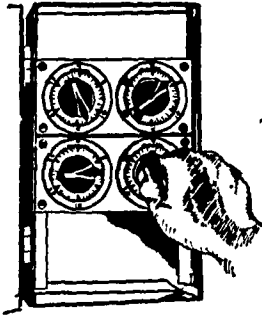
Local Guernsey Cows Classify Excellent

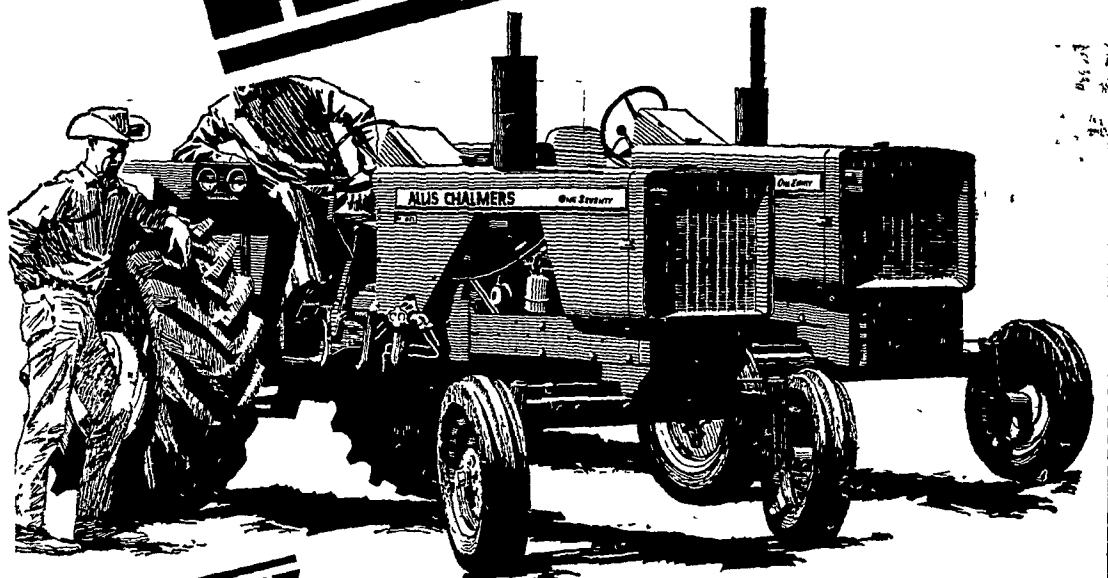
