Junior Ag Club Lists Winners Of Livestock Judging Event

Members of the Junior Agriculture Club and the Elementary Agriculture Program of the Eastern Lancaster County School District recently completed a livestock evaluation and judging contest. This judging was done as part of a unit of study and each member judged five classes of animals as part of their class activity.

Three hundred and fifty students completed the judging. The students having the two highest scores received a registered Guernsey heifer calf donated by Dr and Mrs C L Lammey of Clamar Guernsey Farm at Honeybrook and a Palomino yearling mare pony donated by Mr. and Mrs. Sam W Groff owner of Sam & Son Texaco of New Holland.

Two boys from the 8th grade Junior Agriculture Club of Garden Spot High School tied for top placing with scores of 460 points

out of a possible 500. Kenneth L. Fox, son of Mr and Mrs Harold Fox, Mohnton R2, received the pony while Raymond W Horning son of Mr and Mrs. Edwin Z. Horning, Denver R1, received the Guernsey calf Ribbons were also awarded to the top ten placings in the 12 schools represented in the program.

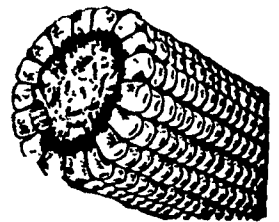

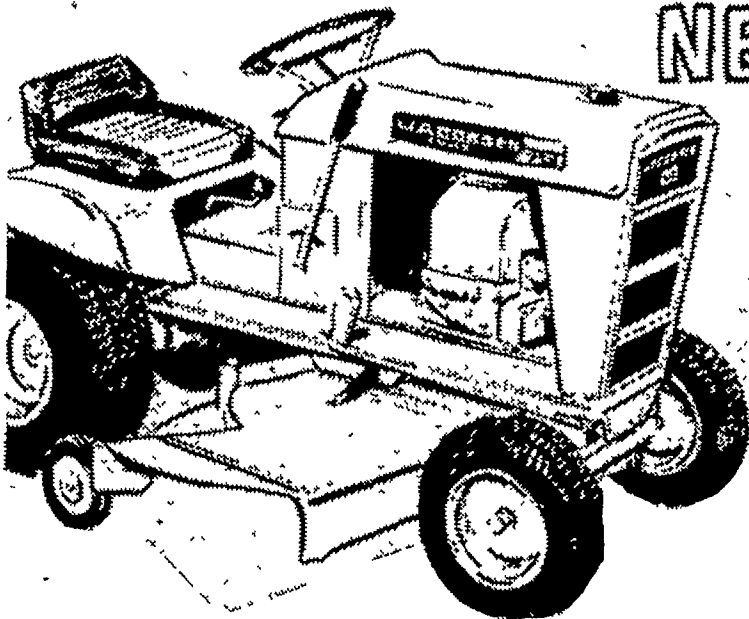
