USE VERBENAS TO **EDGE FLOWERBEDS**

Use verbenas as edging when planting your flower beds this year. Their fragrant flowers in white, pink, rose, red, maroon and purple bloom from midsummer until frost.

Verbenas are low, spreading plants with soft foliage and flowers in flat heads. According to a Pennsylvania State University correspondence course on annual flowers, they grow from 8 to 18 inches tall and spread 2 feet when planted in fertile soil fully exposed to sun.


