tion to the Arthritis Foundation. They will provide a meeting place for the community 4-H Club for Fulton and Little Britain townships.

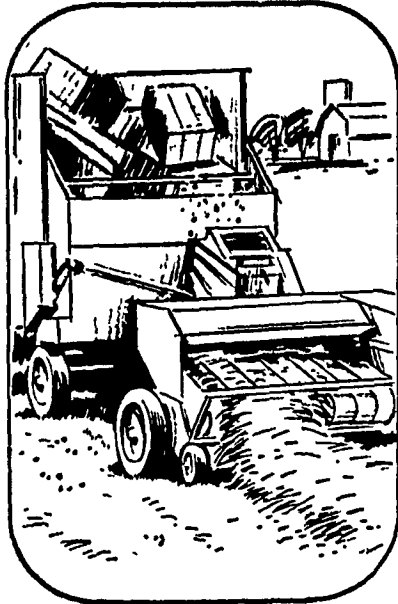
The Youth Committee hold a dance for the community young people May 18 and will have another one June 15 from 8 to 11 p.m. with "Living End" orchestra providing the music.

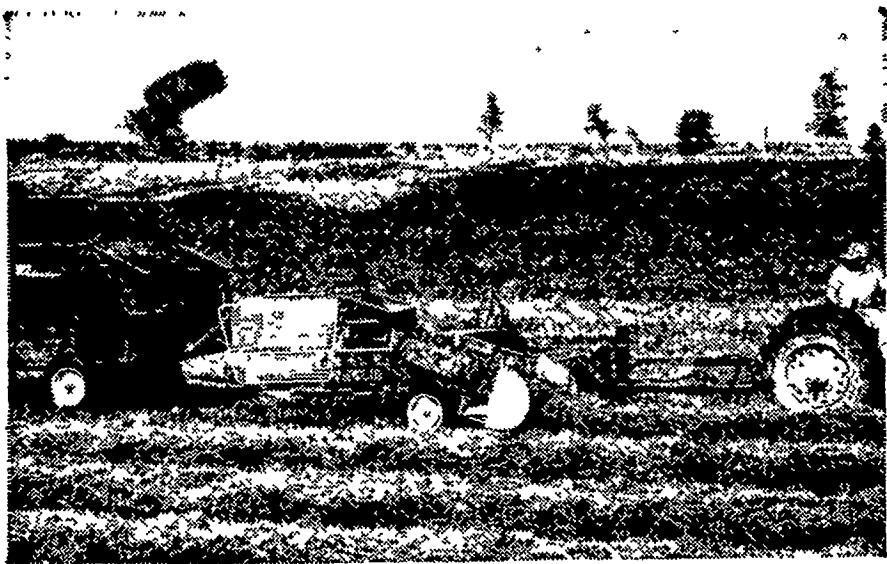
