William M. Buchter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Buchter of Ephrata R1, has been named the recipient of the 1968 DeKalb Agricultural Award given to the outstanding senior in vocational agriculture at Ephrata High School.

Buchter served as president of the Closter FFA Chapter his senior year and was a 1968 Keystone Farmer Degree winner. In 1965 he was named winner of the Ephrata Jaycee Steer.

His farming program consisted of hogs, 1 sow and litter, field corn, tobacco and a steer. He exhibited his livestock at the Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition and the State Farm Show. While attending the State FFA convention, Buchter won a

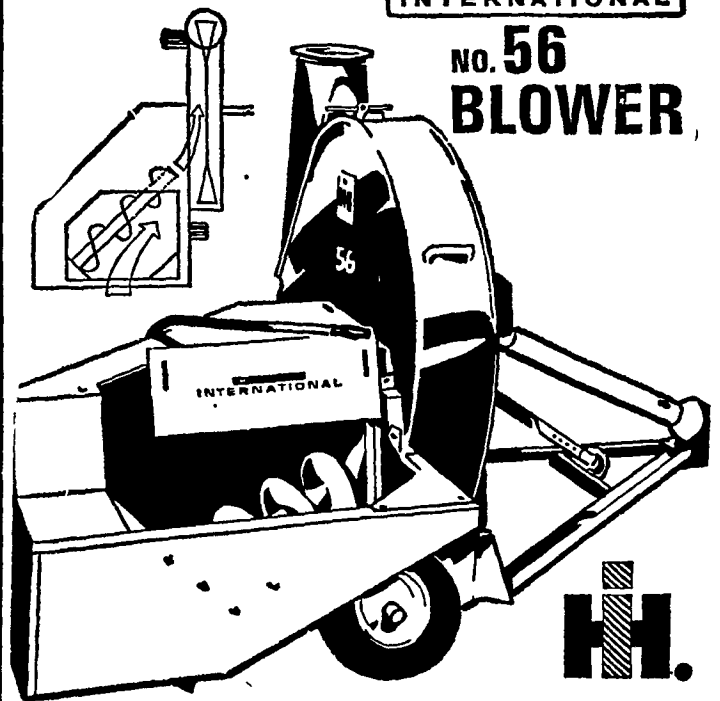
