The gift of the month was received by Mrs. Jacob Boose. Several members served refreshments and entertained the Lancaster County Unit at Embreeville on May 31.

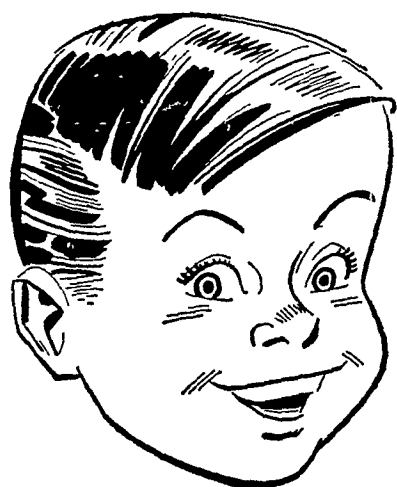
