35TH ANNIVERSARY COMMEMORATIVE CEREMONY NATIONAL FARM PROGRAMS

Formal ceremonies to observe the 35th Anniversary of National Farm Programs will be held Friday, June 28th at 1:30 p.m. at the Harrisburg Area Community College in Harrisburg. College is located at 3300 Cameron Street Road, one-fourth mile north of the State Farm Show Building.

James W. White, Chairman of the Pa. State ASC Committee will conduct the meeting and present a Certificate of Merit to those who served with Triple A from 1933 to 1940.

The primary purpose of this ceremony is to recognize individuals associated with the agency in the thirties, but it is open to the general public.

Those scheduled on the program include Edwin A. Jaenke, Associate Administrator of ASCS; the Honorable Leland H. Bull, Pa. Secretary of Agriculture; and leaders of major State farm organizations.

They have no records of persons serving from 1933 to 1940, and ask that any person connected with AAA during this period contact the County office by June 21st.

The program should be of interest to all their Committeemen and farmers. Please let them know if you plan to attend, so they may report the estimated number that will attend from Lancaster County.

CCC GRAIN BINS

The ten CCC grain bins shipped to Lancaster County were sold at public auction on June 11th, at an average price of \$512.10.

Interested farmers who did not get bins should contact the County office, since as of this date, there are still bins available in nearby counties.

WHEAT PRICE SUPPORT

Farmers enrolled in the 1968 Wheat program are eligible for price support loans on their 1968 wheat crop.

Wheat can be stored on the farm or in approved warehouses. Loan rate for farm stored wheat is \$1.41 per bushel and about 10c per bushel less if stored in a warehouse.

1969 WHEAT ALLOTMENTS

Preliminary work on 1969 Wheat allotments has been completed.

After the National allotment has been announced, individual allotment notices will be mailed to all farmers.

Farmers are reminded that any appeal on the wheat allotment must be filed within fifteen days of the date on the allotment notice.

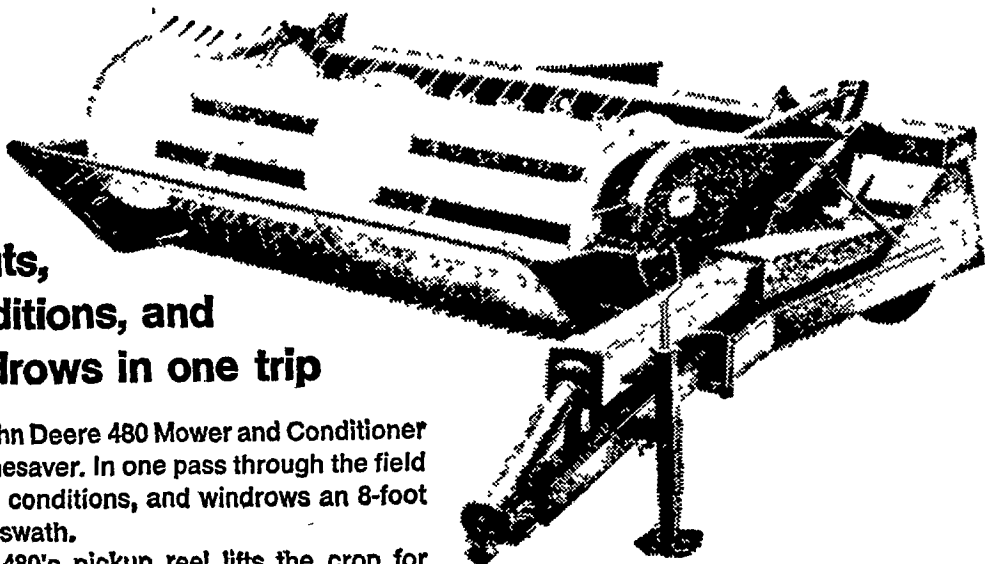

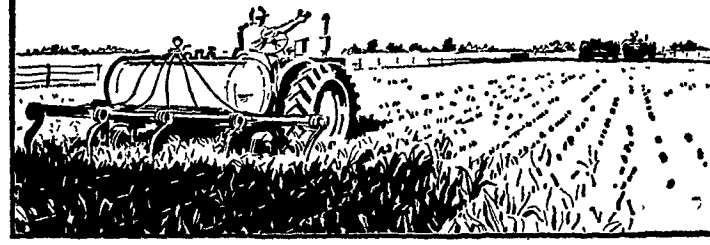
