The Eastern Tent Caterpillar is here, the brownish-green worm with a stripe about 1 to 1½ inches long, and we suggest that property owners keep their trees and shrubs sprayed with DDT, malathion, or lead arsenate; these poisons will kill the worms as they eat the foliage from the plants. In severe cases the caterpillars will form a web around a twig or several branches in which they will stay and defoliate the area. Infestation is quite common at this time of the year and protective sprays are recommended weekly.

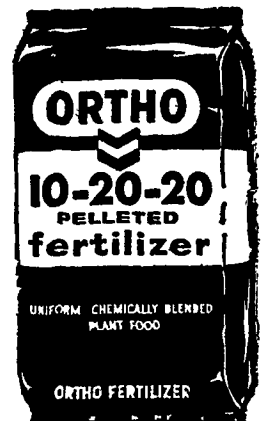
